EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This report fulfills the reporting requirements under Hamilton Police Service Board Policy P-010 and provides a public overview of reportable use-of-force incidents involving Hamilton Police Service in 2025.
- In 2025, Hamilton Police recorded 203 person-involved use-of-force incidents, a 28% decrease from 2024 and the lowest level observed during the six-year reporting period.
- The report summarizes key trends, incident circumstances, available demographic information, and the policy, training, and oversight framework governing police use of force.
- Use-of-force remained concentrated in higher-risk situations, particularly weapon-related incidents and warrant executions, which together accounted for nearly half of all incidents.
- Available demographic information, including perceived gender, age, and race, is reported to support transparency and ongoing monitoring. These findings are descriptive and will continue to be examined through the Service's Race and Identity-Based Data Strategy and Community Advisory Panel.
- Overall, the report demonstrates a continued decline in use-of-force incidents and reinforces the Service's commitment to transparency, accountability, community engagement, and continuous improvement.

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Introduction

This report is intended to provide the Hamilton Police Board and members of the public with the information required under the Board's Use-of-Force Policy No. P-010. It includes specific details as outlined in the Board's reporting requirements:

1. The number of use-of-force incidents and reports;
2. A description of the type of force used;
3. Time of day of the use-of-force;
4. The number of armed and unarmed subjects;
5. The unit the member worked in at the time the use-of-force occurred;
6. The number of years of service the member had at the time the use-of-force occurred;
7. Member injuries and subject injuries related to use-of-force incidents;
8. The perceived race of the subject of the use-of-force;
9. Details of de-escalation training provided and the number of members who received such training.

As directed by the Board's policy, this report includes data for the past five years, where applicable. It also aims to inform readers about relevant legislation, the application of use-of-force, governance and oversight, training, reporting methodology, community relations, and trends and patterns in the data.

The Chief of Police shall further provide any other relevant information that may assist the board in understanding the application of the use-of-force and possible trends. The board shall make the report available to the public.

Understanding Police Use-of-Force

Police officers may encounter situations where the use-of-force is necessary to protect members of the public, themselves, or the individual involved in the interaction. In Ontario, legislation, regulations, court decisions, and the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms* govern the use-of-force by police. These legal and professional standards require that any force used by police be necessary, reasonable, and proportionate to the circumstances.

The Hamilton Police Service recognizes that use-of-force incidents can have significant impacts on the individuals involved and may have broader effects on families, communities, and public trust. For that reason, understanding how force is regulated, how officers are trained, how incidents are reviewed, and how the data is collected is an important part of transparency and accountability.

The following section provides background on the legal framework governing police use-of-force, officer training and decision-making, oversight and accountability processes, and the reporting methodology used throughout this report. This context is intended to support informed public understanding of the statistics and analysis that follow.

Legislation, Regulation, and the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms*

The authority for police officers to use force is established through legislation, regulation, and common law. Key legal authorities include the *Criminal Code of Canada*, the *Community Safety and Policing Act* (CSPA), related provincial regulations, and decisions of courts that interpret how these laws apply in practice.

In addition, the Canadian *Charter of Rights and Freedoms* protects individuals from cruel or unusual treatment, including excessive or inappropriate use-of-force by police. Together, these legal principles require that police officers use force only where authorized by law and only to the extent that is necessary, reasonable, and proportionate to the circumstances.

Broadly, police use-of-force in Canada is guided by several key principles:

1. Police officers may use force in the execution of duty only if permitted by statute or the common law. More particularly, the statutory or common law authority on which an officer relies when using force must apply to the particular duty that the officer is carrying out.
2. Even when the use-of-force may be authorized to carry out a particular type of duty, a police officer does not possess an unrestricted right to use force. The lawful use-of-force by police is constrained by the principles of necessity, proportionality, and reasonableness.
3. An officer's use-of-force may be excessive if the officer did not have the authority to use force, or otherwise if it violates the principles of proportionality, necessity, and/or reasonableness. Under necessity, an officer may not use force if there are reasonable non-violent tactical options available to the officer, by which their lawful objective would likely be accomplished.
4. "De-escalation" is a term that refers to non-use-of-force tactical options that a police officer may use when confronting a violent or non-compliant individual, or for use-of-force options designed to obtain compliance on the part of a subject.
5. Police officers possess a measure of reasonable discretion in determining whether force is required, and if so, to what degree. Police officers engage in dangerous work, and, on occasion, must act quickly in emergencies. Assessments regarding the use-of-force need not be based on a "standard of perfection".

Decision-Making in the Moment: Why Might Police Use Force?

The decision to use force is never taken lightly by a police officer. Officers are required to continually assess situations that may involve rapidly evolving risks to the public, themselves, or the individual involved. In many situations, officers are responding to uncertain or incomplete information and must make decisions quickly to protect safety and prevent harm.

Police officers are trained to use communication and other de-escalation techniques whenever possible. In many daily interactions, verbal communication, time, distance, teamwork, and other de-escalation techniques may resolve situations without the need for physical force. However, these situations generally do not require a Use-of-Force Report to be completed. As a result, there is currently no reliable way through use-of-force reporting to measure the number of interactions where de-escalation successfully prevented a reportable use-of-force incident from occurring.

When force is used, it is intended to achieve one or more lawful objectives (see below). These may include protecting the public, protecting officers or other individuals from harm, preventing the continuation of an offence, effecting a lawful arrest, controlling a subject's behaviour, or defending against an assault or attack.



Why Might Police Use Force?

Oversight for Use-of-Force: How Are Incidents Reviewed?

Police use-of-force is subject to legal requirements, internal review, and external oversight. Under [section 26 of the Criminal Code](#), a person authorized by law to use force may still be criminally responsible where excessive force is used. In practice, this means that police use-of-force must be lawful, necessary, reasonable, and proportionate to the circumstances.

[Ontario Regulation 391/23](#) sets out when officers are required to complete a Use-of-Force Report. This includes situations where an officer draws or points a firearm, discharges a firearm, uses or displays a conducted energy weapon, uses another weapon on a person, or uses physical force that results in an injury requiring medical attention. At the Hamilton Police Service, use-of-force reports move through several levels of review before submission to the Ministry of the Solicitor General. This includes review by a Staff Sergeant, Commander, and Use-of-Force Sergeant.



Use-of-Force Review Stages

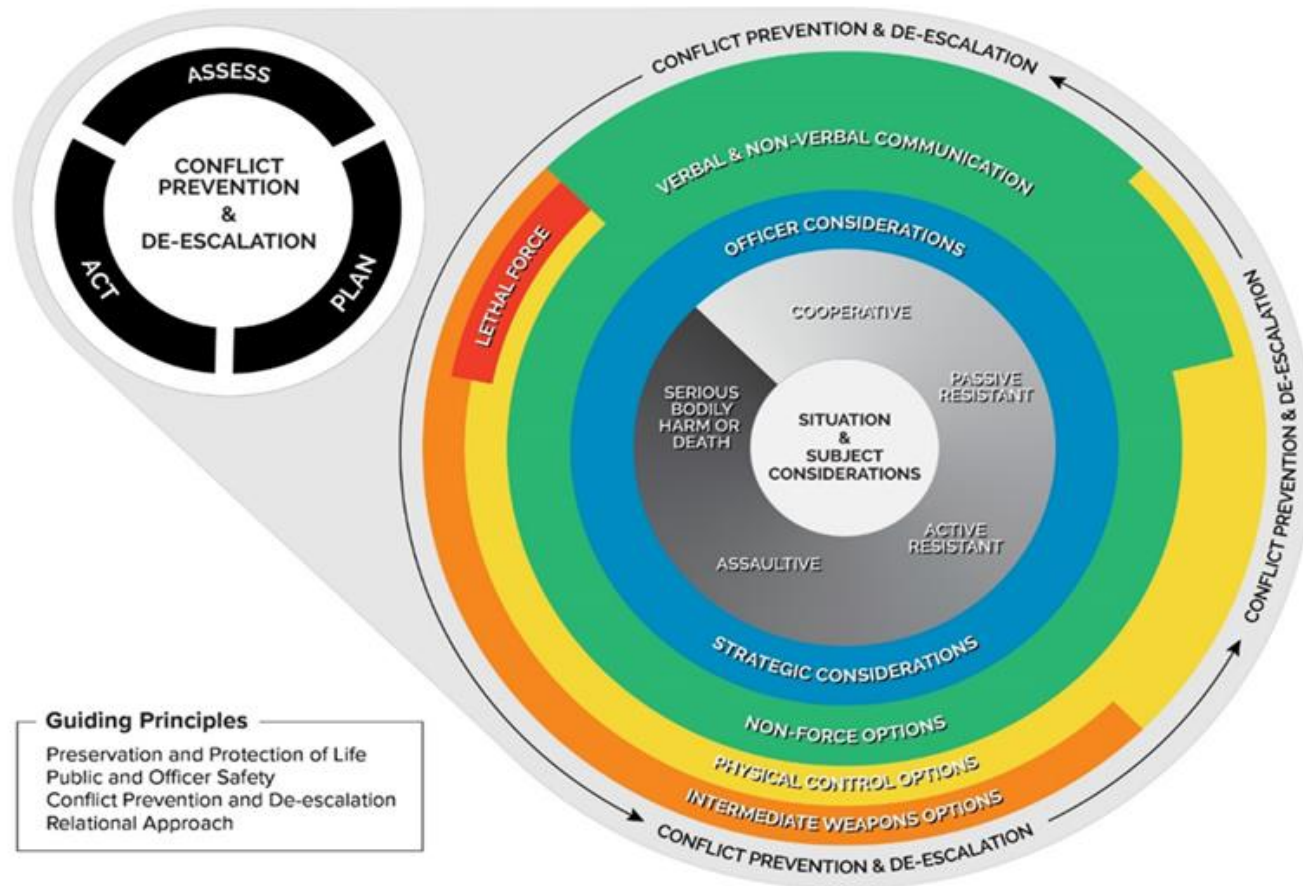
Internally, the Hamilton Police Service has a Professional Standards Branch responsible for overseeing the use-of-force. This branch is authorized to investigate any incidents where the use-of-force may meet the threshold for being considered excessive. In 2025, there were six excessive force allegations, none of which were substantiated. Externally, the Hamilton Police Service is required to notify the Special Investigations Unit (SIU) under Section 15 of the *Special Investigations Act* whenever police officers are involved in an interaction that results in (a) the death or serious injury of a person or (b) the discharge of a firearm at a person. Lastly, members of the public are able to report use-of-force complaints to the Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA).

What Training Do Officers Receive?

Use-of-Force training in Ontario is based on a provincially standardized framework established by the Ministry of the Solicitor General. In 2023, Ontario introduced the Ontario Public–Police Interactions Training Aid, which replaced the former 2004 Ontario Use-of-Force Model. The updated framework places conflict prevention and de-escalation at the centre of police-public interactions.

The Training Aid was developed by the Ontario Police College and is intended to guide officers in all police-public interactions, not only those involving force. A central feature is the **Assess–Plan–Act framework**, which trains officers to assess situations as they evolve, develop a response plan, and adjust their actions as circumstances change. This includes considering the subject's behaviour, the presence of weapons, the environment, officer and public safety, communication options, de-escalation strategies, physical control options, intermediate weapons, and lethal force options.

Ontario Public-Police Interactions Training Aid (2023)



The officer continuously assesses the interactions and selects the most reasonable option(s) relative to the subject and circumstances given available resources and time.



De-escalation refers to verbal and non-verbal strategies intended to reduce the intensity of a conflict or crisis, gain voluntary compliance where possible, and reduce the need for force. These strategies may include communication, time, distance, containment, repositioning, teamwork, and other tactical options.

Use-of-Force training begins prior to officers' attendance at OPC. **Below outlines the training provided to new officers and sworn officers working within the Hamilton Police Service.**

Hamilton Police Service is committed to providing training that supports and reflects the needs of a diverse community. As part of the 2022–2026 Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Strategy, the service has integrated EDI principles into training through experiential learning.

Officers engage in scenario-based training that incorporates cultural competency and an EDI lens, using real-time use-of-force scenarios that reflect the rich diversity of Hamilton’s communities, perspectives, and lived experiences. This hands-on learning is complemented by classroom sessions focused on the impact of unconscious bias, microaggressions, and community perceptions of policing.

In addition, the EDI, Hate Crime, and Community Engagement Unit provided EDI fundamentals and cultural competency training to new hires including sworn Officers, Special Constables, Cadets, Communications staff and volunteers. Topics included understanding anti-racism, 2SLGBTQIA terminology, and unconscious bias. In 2025, the Unit facilitated EDI workshops open to all members of the Hamilton Police Service—both sworn and civilian—to enhance their understanding of key issues related to community policing. These workshops focused on community-centered topics such as dismantling anti-Black racism, addressing discrimination against 2SLGBTQIA+ communities, exploring the principles of Sikhism, and increasing awareness of both visible and invisible disabilities.

Lastly, on April 1, 2024, the Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA) came into effect, replacing the Police Services Act established in 1990. The new act contains legislative requirements that reflect the previous act, containing training components with regard to use-of-force and de-escalation. The CSPA now requires police officers in Ontario to successfully complete training in Mental Health Crisis Response, as well as Thematic Training on the following topics: human rights, systemic racism, the diverse multicultural and multiracial nature of Ontario society, as well as rights and cultures of First Nation, Métis, and Inuit Peoples. Beginning September 2025 all HPS sworn members and Special Constables participate in this mandatory training.

Use-of-Force Reporting and Data Collection

Police services across Ontario are required to submit standardized electronic Use-of-Force Reports to the Ministry of the Solicitor General whenever force is used or displayed in circumstances prescribed under Ontario Regulation 391/23. This provincial reporting framework is intended to support oversight, accountability, training, and province-wide analysis of police use-of-force. The use of a standardized provincial report helps ensure that information is collected consistently across police services in Ontario. The report captures a broad range of information relating to the interaction, including:

- the type of force used,
- officer response options,
- de-escalation efforts,
- subject behaviour,
- perceived weapon involvement,
- injuries,
- situational and environmental factors,
- and subject demographic information

In 2023, the Ministry significantly modernized the provincial Use-of-Force Report to include additional detail intended to better support training, policy development, and analysis. The revised report captures more detailed information regarding officer decision-making, de-escalation efforts, situational context, and the sequence of officer responses during the interaction.

At the same time, there are important limitations to the data that should be considered when interpreting the findings presented throughout this report. Use-of-Force reports are administrative records completed by officers following an incident and are designed primarily for oversight and reporting purposes. While they provide important operational information, they do not fully capture every aspect of a police-public interaction, including tone, communication, perception, community impact, or the full sequence of events leading up to the interaction.

In 2020, amendments under the *Anti-Racism Act* mandated Ontario police services to collect race-based data relating to use-of-force incidents and prescribed the method of collection. As part of this framework, officers report the perceived race of the subject involved in the interaction. The decision to collect perceived race, rather than self-identified race, is intentional and reflects the province's objective of examining how perception may influence police interactions and decision-making.

The provincial reporting framework defines perceived race as information informed by observable characteristics and contextual information available to the officer at the time of the interaction. This may include visual observations, information received through dispatch or witnesses, prior knowledge of the subject, or other contextual cues. The report therefore captures officer perception at the time force was used and should not be interpreted as verified identity or self-identification.

The 2023 reporting changes also introduced broader use of team reporting, allowing multiple officers involved in the same incident to submit a collective report in certain circumstances where the same level of force was applied. This approach reduces duplication of reporting but may limit the availability of some officer-specific information within the dataset.

Throughout this report, the statistics and analysis are intended to support transparency, informed public understanding, and meaningful community dialogue regarding police use-of-force in Hamilton. At the same time, the data should be interpreted carefully and within the broader operational, legal, and social context in which police-public interactions occur. A dictionary of key terms used throughout this report is included in the Appendix to support consistent interpretation of the statistics and terminology.

1. Number of use-of-force incidents and reports

In 2025, the Hamilton Police Service recorded approximately 198,356 interactions with the public. Of these, 203 incidents resulted in a use-of-force report involving an individual.

An additional 8 occurrences involved force being displayed in response to high-risk calls for service, without direct physical contact with a subject. These situations typically involved officers drawing or maintaining firearms while responding to reports of weapons, stabbings, break-and-enters in progress, barricaded subjects, or other circumstances presenting a credible risk of serious bodily harm. In each instance, officers cleared or contained the scene for public and officer safety; however, no subject was encountered at the time force was displayed.

There were also 20 incidents involving animals, the majority of which were humane destruction calls involving injured wildlife requiring euthanasia. The remaining incidents involved aggressive or uncontrolled animals, where force options were used to safely contain the animal. These incidents are reported separately, as they do not involve direct police–public interactions. In total, use-of-force was reported in 224 interactions, generating 250 reports submitted to the Ministry of the Solicitor General.

Each of these incidents carries the potential for significant impact on the individuals involved and may have broader effects on families, communities, and public trust. The Service recognizes the importance of these impacts and remains committed to transparent reporting, accountability, and ongoing learning to support continuous improvement. Understanding how often force is used—and in what circumstances—is an important part of that commitment. Research from Canada suggests that public perceptions of force frequency can differ from administrative data, particularly for more serious forms of force such as firearm use (Bennell et al., 2021; Bennell et al., 2022; Khanizadeh et al., 2025). This report provides a local, evidence-based reference point to support informed community dialogue about use-of-force in Hamilton.

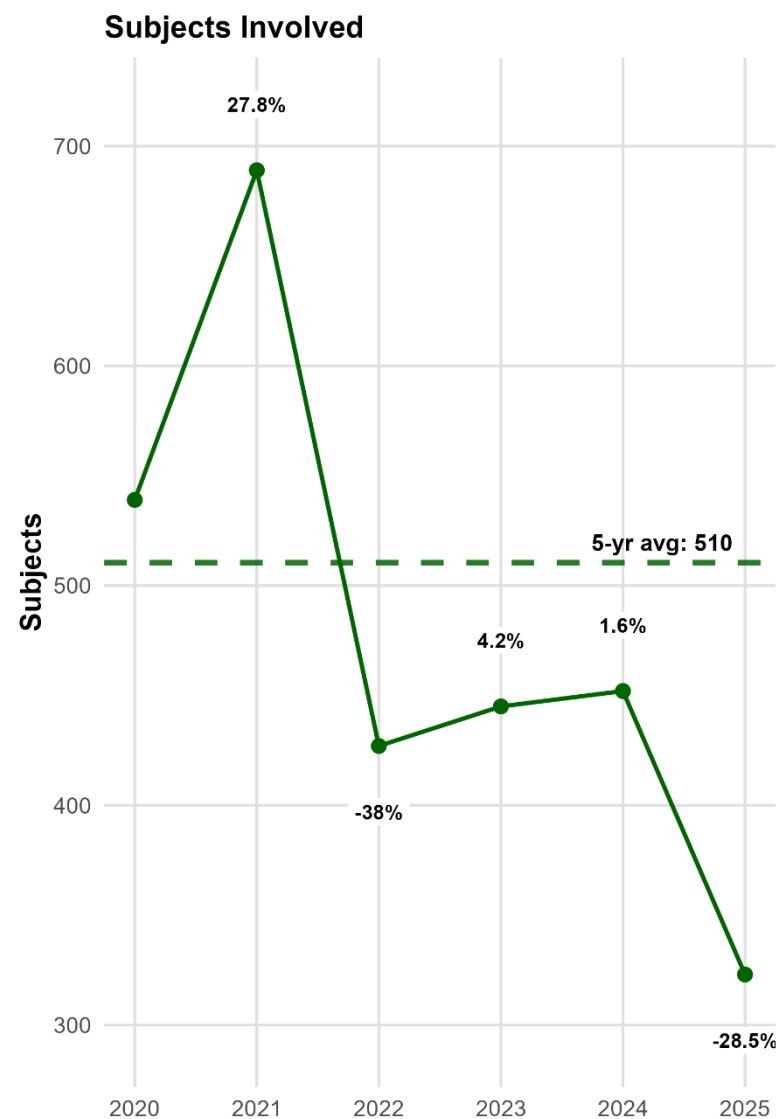
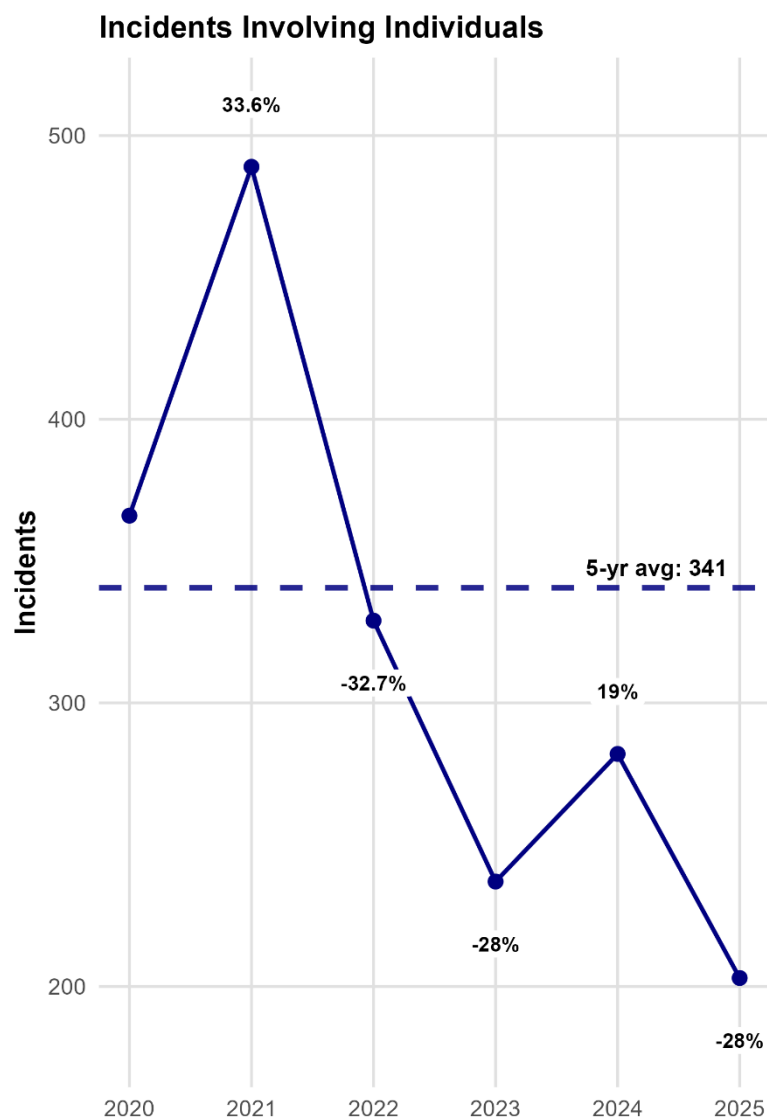
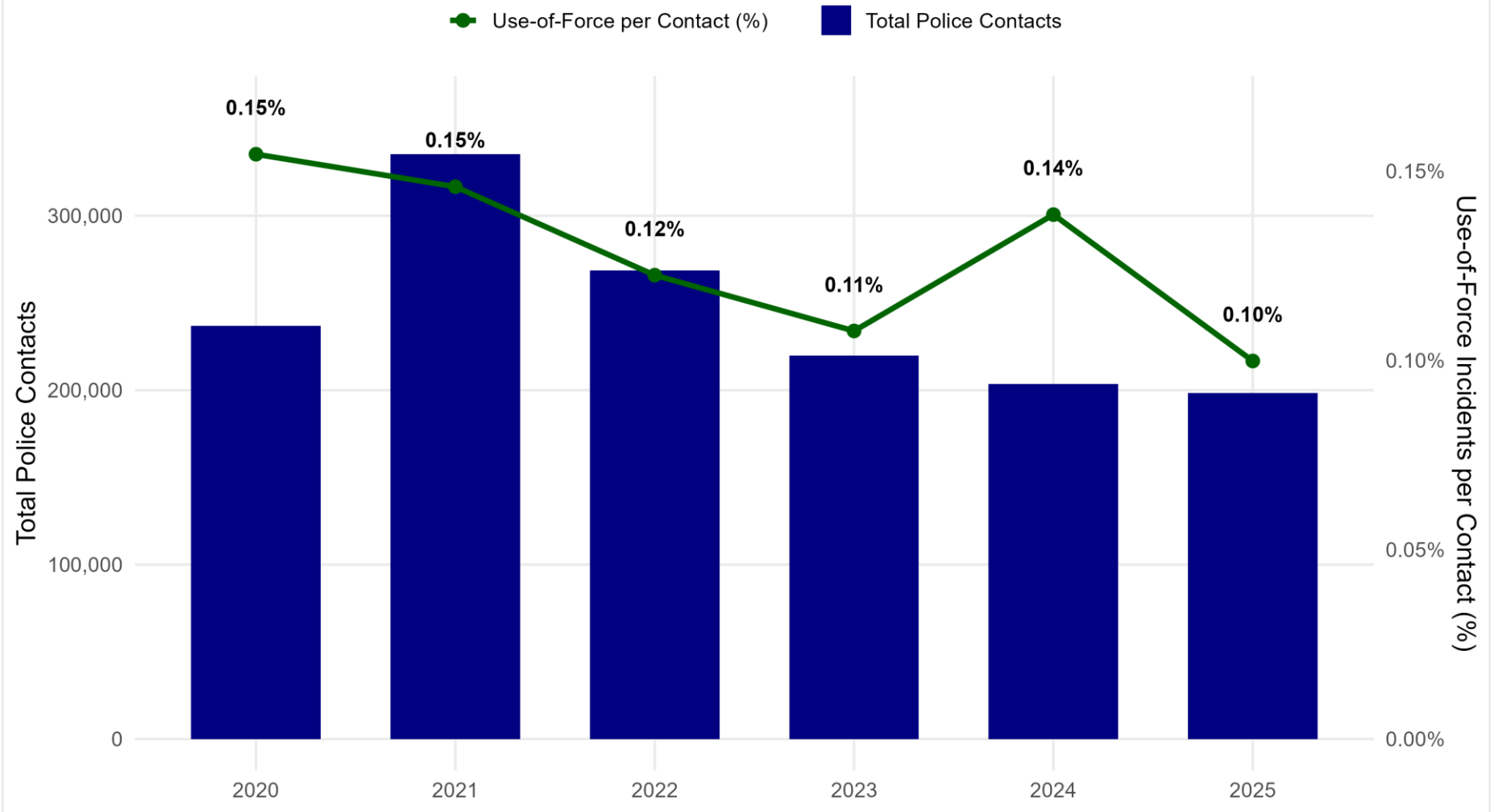


Figure 2: Use-of-Force Incidents as a Proportion of Police Contacts (2020–2025)

Use-of-Force involving an individual declined in 2025, both compared to the previous year and relative to the five-year average. As shown in **Figures 1 and 2**, both the number of incidents and the number of individuals involved have followed a downward trend over the six-year period, with some year-to-year fluctuation. In 2025, the Service recorded 203 incidents, representing a 28% decrease from 2024 (282 incidents) and a 40.4% decrease relative to the five-year average (2020–2024). This is the lowest number of incidents observed during the reporting period. A similar pattern is observed in the number of individuals involved. In 2025, 323 individuals were involved, reflecting a 28.5% decrease from 2024 (452 individuals) and a 36.7% decrease relative to the five-year average.

2. Type of force used

In Ontario, police use-of-force follows a structured approach based on the level of risk in a situation. Officers have a range of options available, from communication and presence to intermediate force options and, in rare cases, lethal force, and are trained to respond in a way that is reasonable and proportionate to the circumstances. While overall use-of-force declined in 2025, examining how force is used provides important context on how officers respond in practice.

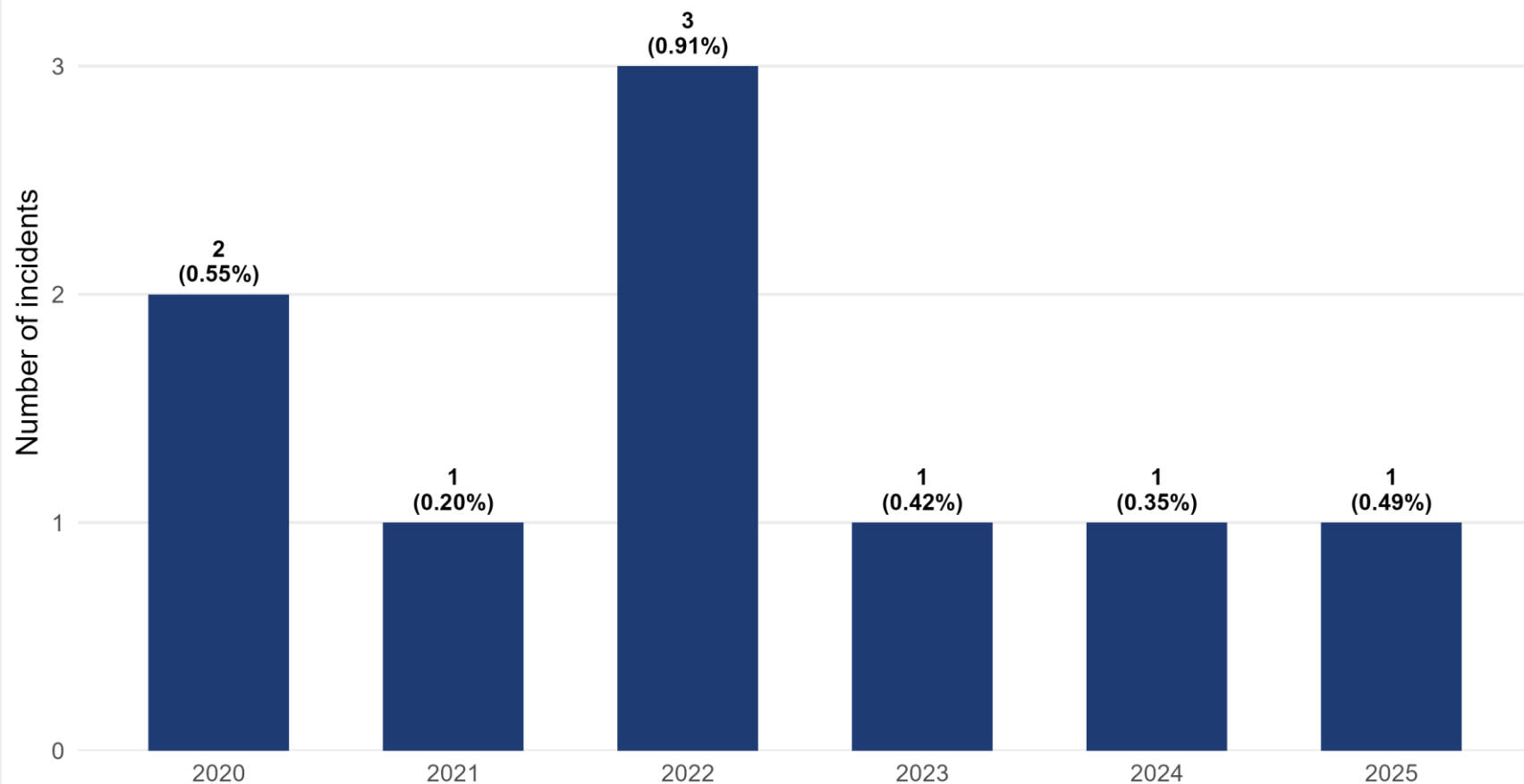


Figure 4: Firearm Point Incidents (2020–2025)

Firearm discharges involving individuals occurred on three occasions or fewer in each year from 2020 to 2025 and accounted for less than 1% of all use-of-force incidents annually. From 2023 to 2025, one firearm discharge was recorded per year (**Figure 3**). Firearm pointing accounts for the majority of lethal force use and provides important context for how officers respond to high-risk situations. **Figure 4** presents firearm pointing incidents and the number of individuals involved from 2020 to 2025. **Two series are shown:** the number of incidents in which a firearm was pointed, and the number of individuals at whom a firearm was pointed. Subject counts for 2020 to 2022 are approximated based on incident-level data, as subject-level records were not available prior to 2023.

Dashed line shows the 5-year average (2020–2024). Labels show year-over-year change.

Both measures follow a similar pattern over time. Firearm pointing reached 218 incidents in 2021, declined through 2022 and 2023, increased to 164 in 2024, and fell to 107 in 2025. This is below the five-year average of 171 incidents and represents the lowest level observed across the six-year period. A similar trend is observed in the number of individuals involved. The number of individuals at whom a firearm was pointed peaked at 374 in 2021, declined in subsequent years, rose to 325 in 2024, and fell to 198 in 2025. This is below the five-year average of 303 and, as with incidents, represents the lowest level observed across the reporting period.

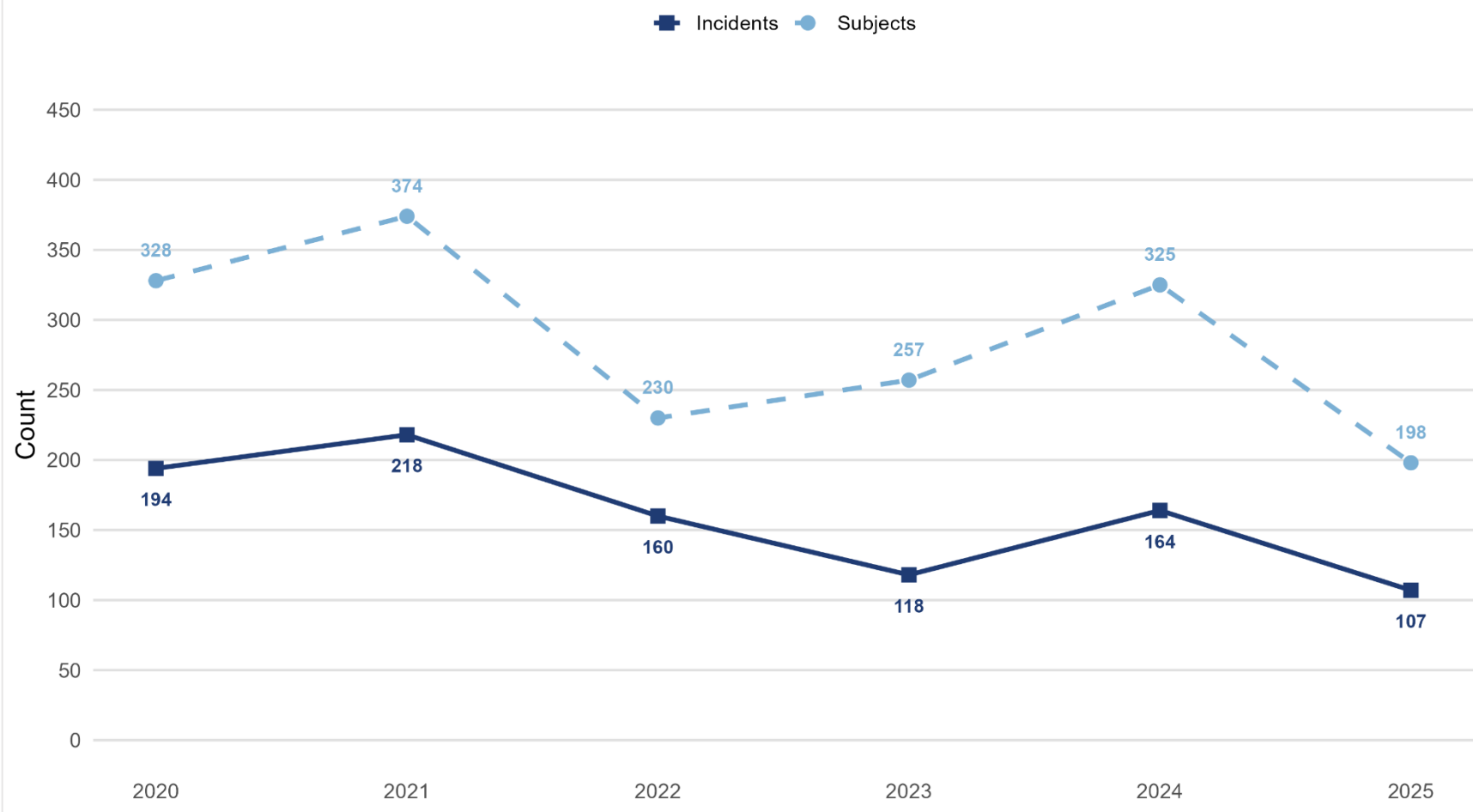


Figure 5: Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW) Incidents (2020–2025)

In addition to firearm-related force, conducted energy weapons (CEWs) represent a commonly used intermediate force option and provide further context on how officers respond to situations involving elevated risk. **Figure 5** presents trends in CEW use from 2020 to 2025, showing both the number of incidents in which a CEW was used and the proportion of all reportable use-of-force incidents involving a CEW. Over this period, CEW use has remained a consistent component of reportable force. In 2025, CEWs were used in 86 incidents, accounting for 42.4% of all use-of-force incidents. This is comparable to 2024 (42.2%), although lower in volume than the previous year, reflecting the broader decline in overall use-of-force incidents.

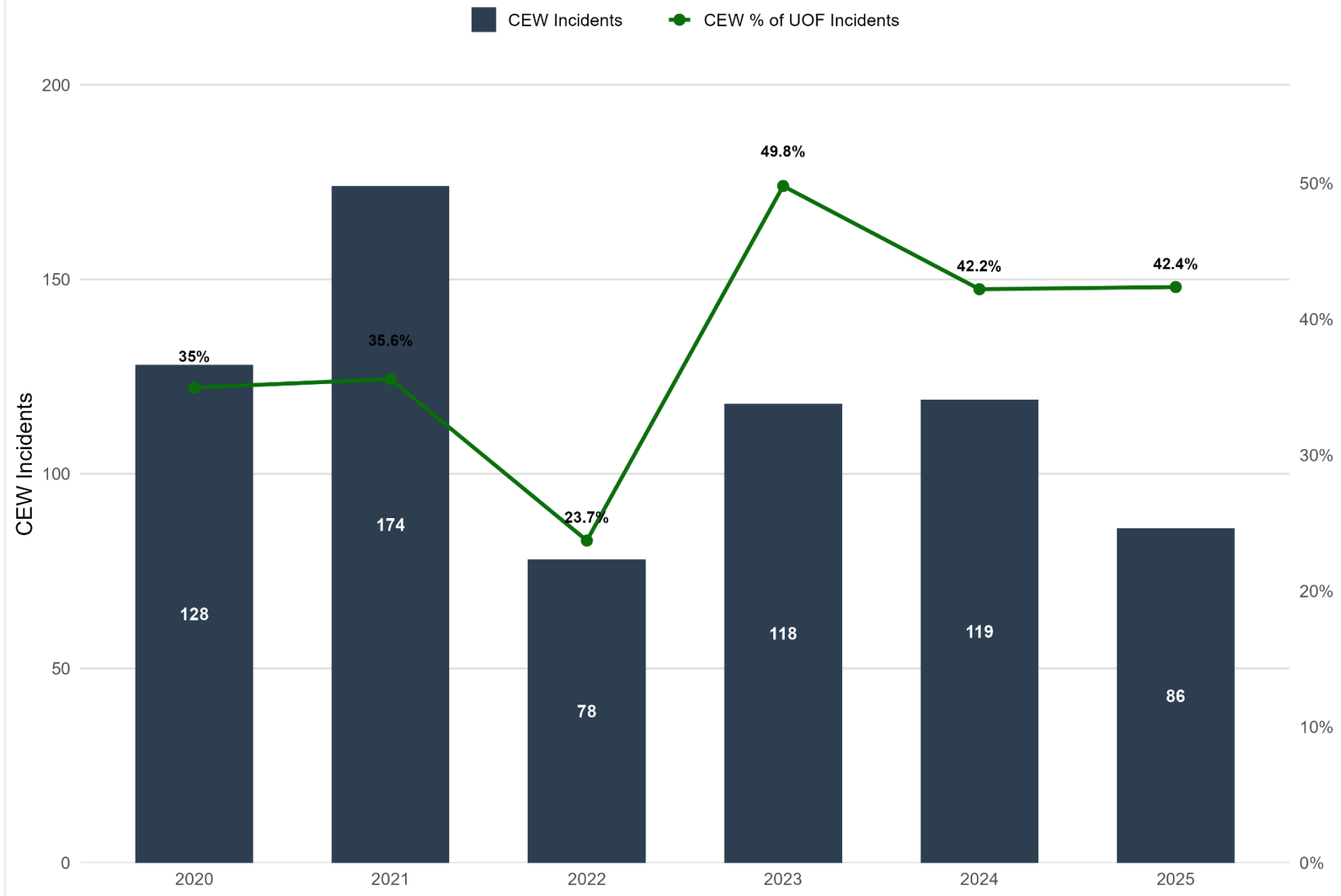


Figure 6: CEW Deployment Level (2023–2025)

Looking more closely at CEW use, **Figure 6** shows the highest level of deployment reached in each CEW-related incident from 2023 to 2025. In 2025, CEWs were involved in 86 incidents. Of these, the highest observed level was **drawn** in 15 incidents (17.4%), **pointed** in 39 incidents (45.4%), and **discharged** in 32 incidents (37.2%). This means that in approximately **62.8% of CEW-related incidents**, the device was drawn or pointed without being discharged. A similar pattern was observed in 2023 and 2024, where a majority of CEW incidents also did not result in discharge.

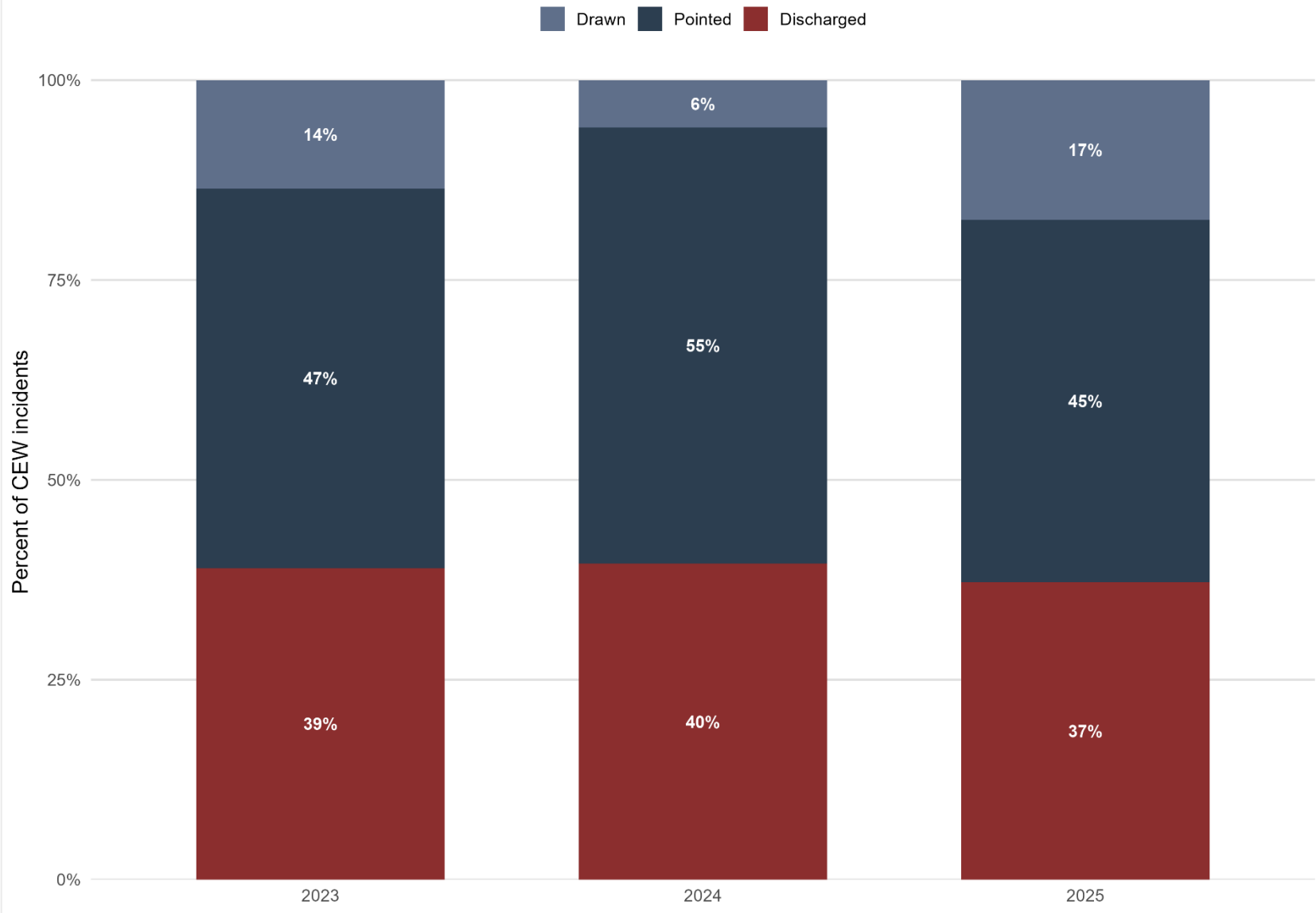


Figure 7: Physical Force / Physical Control (2020–2025)

In 2025, there were 71 reported incidents involving physical force, representing a decrease from 92 incidents in 2024 (**Figure 7**). Over the past several years, the number of incidents involving physical force has remained relatively stable, with some year-to-year variation. When examined at the subject level, a similar pattern is observed. In 2025, physical force was applied to 128 individuals, compared to 156 in 2024 and 104 in 2023. These figures reflect variability across years, consistent with changes in overall use-of-force volume. Physical force, or physical control, refers to the application of force directly by an officer and includes a range of techniques. These may involve “soft” empty hand methods such as holding, gripping, or joint manipulation, as well as more forceful techniques such as strikes or grounding.

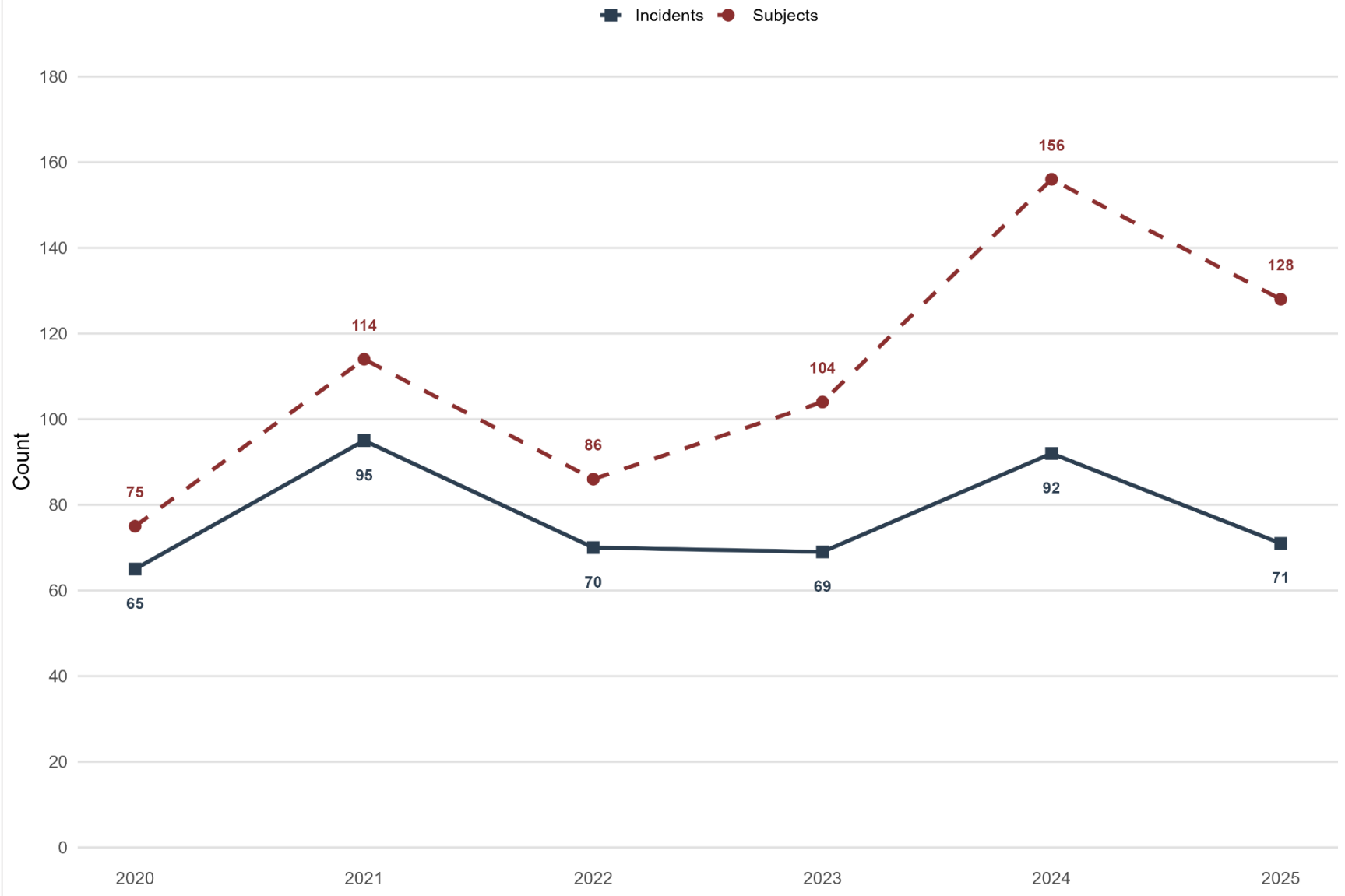
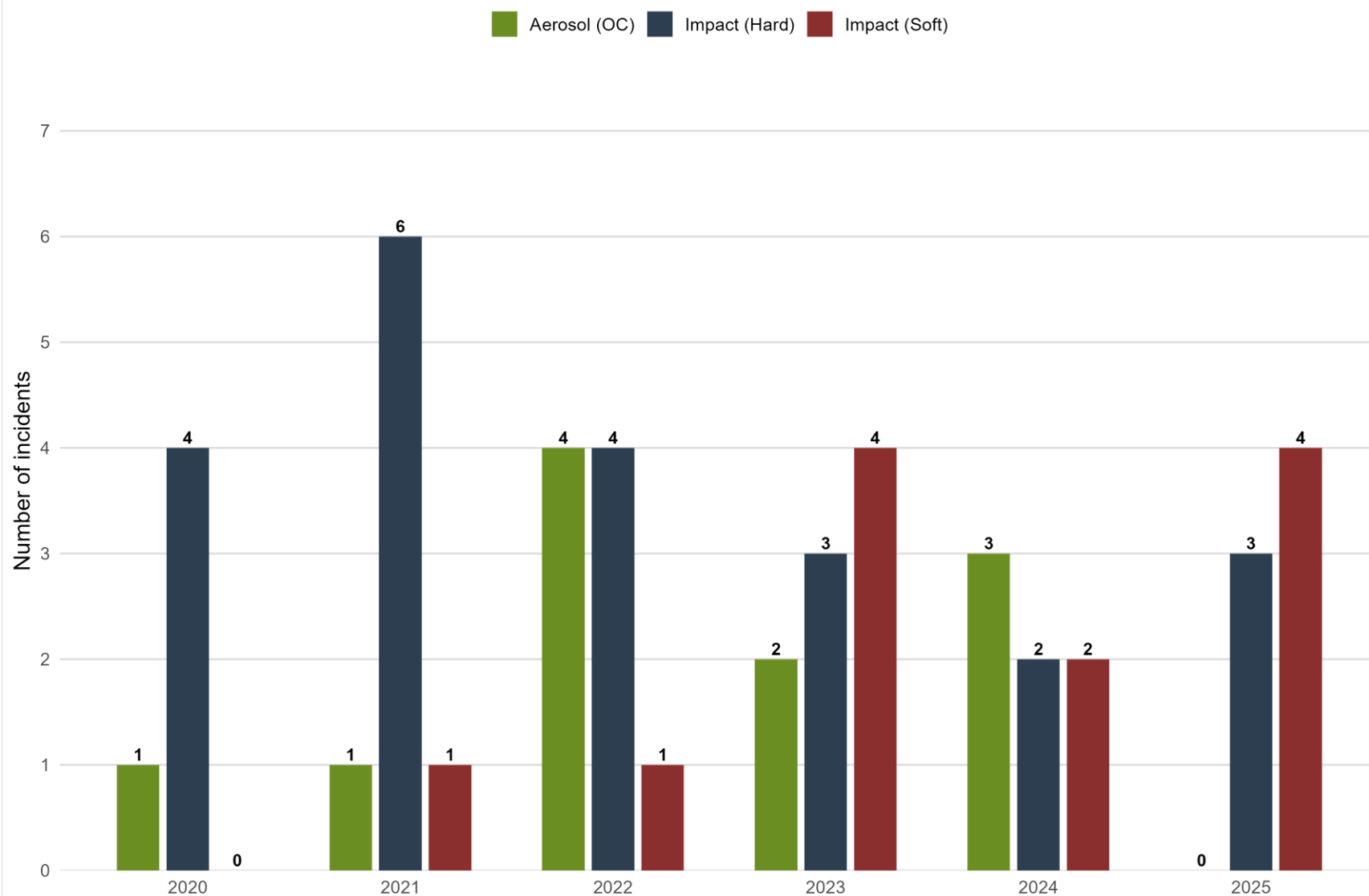


Figure 8: Aerosol and Impact Weapon Use (2020–2025)

The use of impact and aerosol weapons remained minimal compared to other use-of-force options (**Figure 8**). In 2025, there were seven total incidents involving these force types, consisting of three incidents involving impact hard techniques and four involving impact soft techniques. No incidents involving aerosol (OC) spray were recorded in 2025. Over the six-year period, the use of these force options has remained consistently low. Impact hard techniques involve the use of a baton to deliver a forceful strike, while impact soft techniques involve using the baton to assist in controlling a subject, such as gaining compliance or facilitating restraint.

3. Time of Day and Location

Beginning in 2023, the Use-of-Force form was updated to record the approximate time that force was applied. Before this, only general lighting conditions (such as daylight or darkness) were captured, which limited how precisely time-of-day patterns could be analyzed. Because of this change, the analysis below focuses on data from 2023 to 2025.

As shown in **Figure 9**, use-of-force incidents are spread fairly evenly throughout the day, with no single time period accounting for most cases. However, a few patterns stand out:

- **Evening (6 PM–12 AM)** continues to account for the largest share of incidents, though it decreased from 33.8% in 2023 to 26.2% in 2024, and then increased slightly to 28.1% in 2025.
- **Overnight (12 AM–6 AM)** incidents have steadily increased, rising from 20.3% in 2023 to 25.1% in 2025.
- **Morning (6 AM–12 PM)** incidents increased in 2024 and remained steady in 2025, making up about one-quarter of all incidents in both years.
- **Afternoon (12 PM–6 PM)** incidents were highest in 2023 and 2024, but declined in 2025.

Interactions with individuals only. Labels show incident count and rate per total use-of-force incidents.

Percentage of CEW-related incidents by highest level of use.

Overall, the figure shows that use-of-force incidents can occur at any time of day. Even though the total number of incidents decreased in 2025, they are not limited to a specific period. The addition of more precise time information allows for a better understanding of when these events occur, and continued tracking will help identify any changes over time.

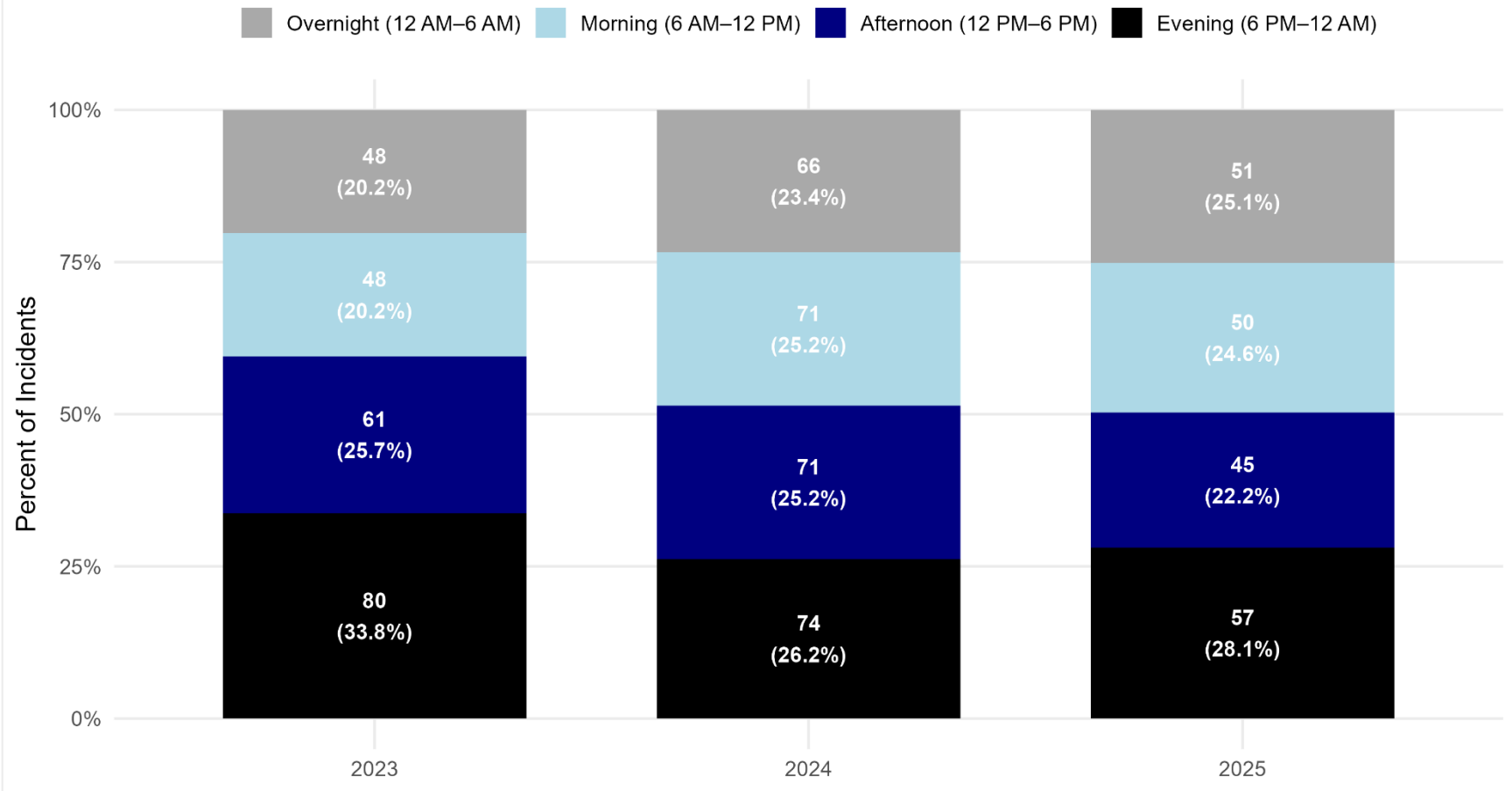


Figure 10: Use of Force Incidents, 2025

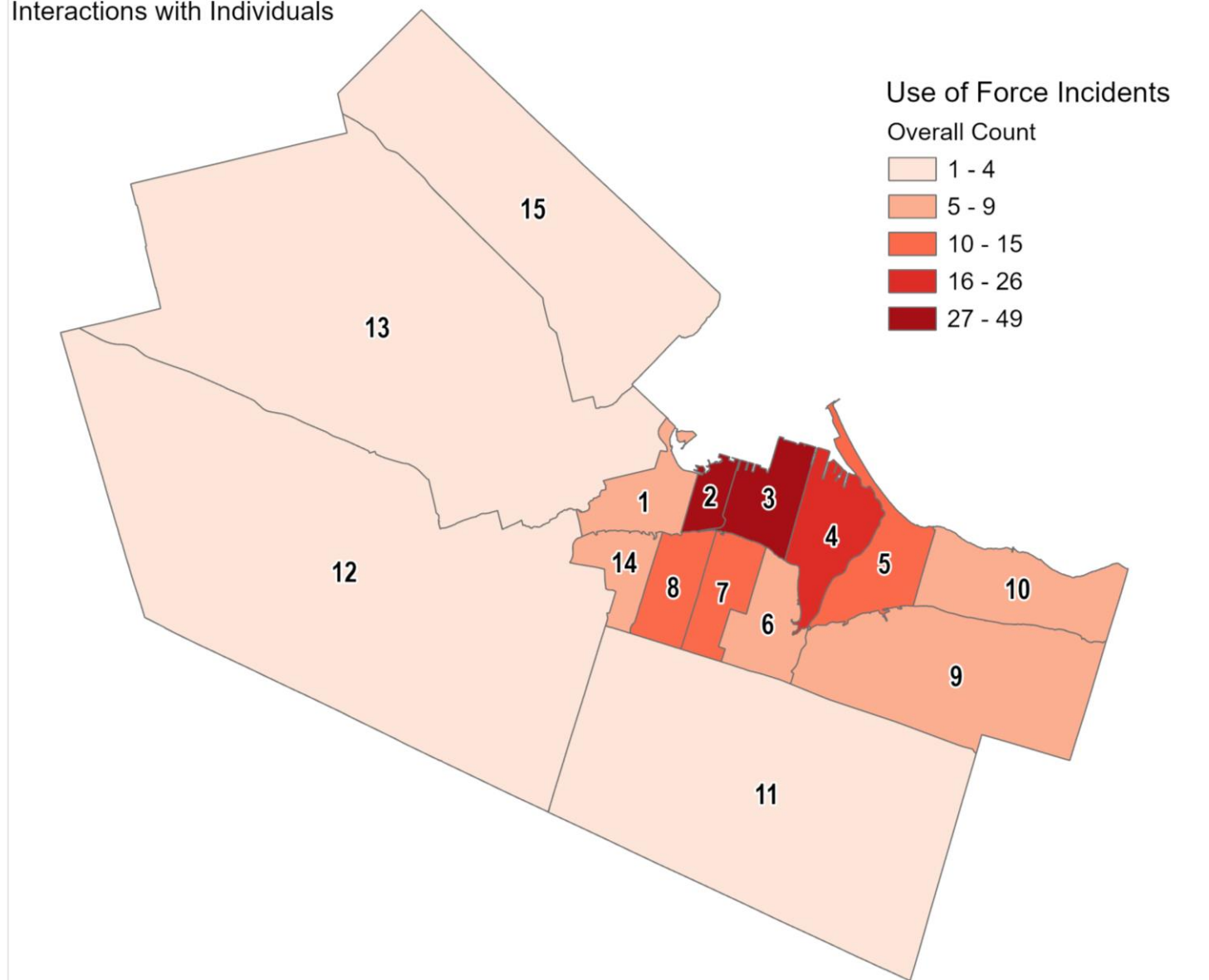


Figure 11: Use of Force Incidents per 1,000 Police Events, 2025

Following the time-of-day patterns, it is also important to examine where use-of-force incidents are occurring across the city. **Figures 10 and 11** show the geographic distribution of incidents in 2025 at the Municipal Ward level using both raw counts and a standardized rate.

Figure 10 shows the total number of use-of-force incidents by Ward. These are unique incidents involving interactions with individuals. Incidents are more concentrated in central wards, including Wards 2, 3, and 4, while lower counts are observed in several outer wards. Overall, this figure shows where incidents are most concentrated in absolute terms across the city. However, this figure does not account for differences in overall police activity across wards. Some areas experience a higher volume of calls for service or police interactions, which can influence the number of use-of-force incidents observed. To provide additional context, **Figure 11** presents use-of-force incidents per 1,000 calls for service, including both officer-initiated and public-generated calls. This approach helps standardize the data, allowing for a more balanced comparison across wards by considering overall levels of police activity.

When viewed in this way, most wards fall within a relatively similar range. For example, several central and east-end wards fall between approximately 1.38 and 2.26 use-of-force incidents per 1,000 calls for service. This suggests that, once overall police activity is taken into account, the frequency of use-of-force is relatively consistent across many parts of the city. In 2025, Ward 10 stands out. It has the highest rate at approximately 2.5 use-of-force incidents per 1,000 calls for service, despite having a lower total number of incidents. Given the smaller number of overall incidents in this ward, this higher rate should be interpreted with caution, as smaller counts can have a greater impact on the calculated rate.

4. Incident Context

Understanding how a use-of-force incident begins provides important context. As shown in **Figure 12**, incidents can be grouped into three categories based on how the interaction originated: citizen-generated calls for service, warrant execution (planned enforcement), and officer-initiated activity. Across the last three years, most incidents arose from citizen-generated calls, where members of the public contacted police to report a concern, conflict, or safety threat.

Warrants accounted for a distinct and meaningful share of incidents each year—17.3% in 2023 (41 incidents), 18.1% in 2024 (51 incidents), and 14.3% in 2025 (29 incidents). These are planned enforcement actions, typically involving known subjects and pre-existing judicial authorization, and are categorically different from reactive calls. Given the nature of warrant execution—often involving subjects with known or suspected links to violence or weapons—lethal force, namely firearm points, was frequently involved. Within the subset of warrant-related use-of-force incidents, firearm pointing was the most common reported force option. Firearm pointing was reported in 85% of warrant-related use-of-force incidents in 2023, 92% in 2024, and 90% in 2025. This reflects the elevated risk profile often associated with warrant execution, including the possibility of known or suspected weapons, violence, or other officer-safety concerns. Importantly, no firearm discharges occurred during warrant executions in any of the three years.

Among non-warrant incidents, the overwhelming majority were citizen-generated. In 2023, 94.5% of non-warrant incidents originated from public calls; in 2024, 95.2%; and in 2025, 97.1%. Officer-initiated incidents—where police identified and acted on a situation without a prior call—declined from 11 incidents in both 2023 and 2024 to 5 in 2025. In 2025, these officer-initiated incidents were concentrated in higher-risk enforcement contexts, including investigation follow-up, person stops, stolen vehicles, traffic enforcement, and weapons-related calls. In these cases, officers were typically responding to specific intelligence, known risk factors, or emerging threats, often involving suspected weapon access, recent violent activity, or attempts to evade police. Overall, these figures reinforce that use-of-force most often occurs in response to community-generated demand, while officer-initiated force represents a small and declining share of total incidents.

Labels show incident count and percentage within year

Interactions with Individuals

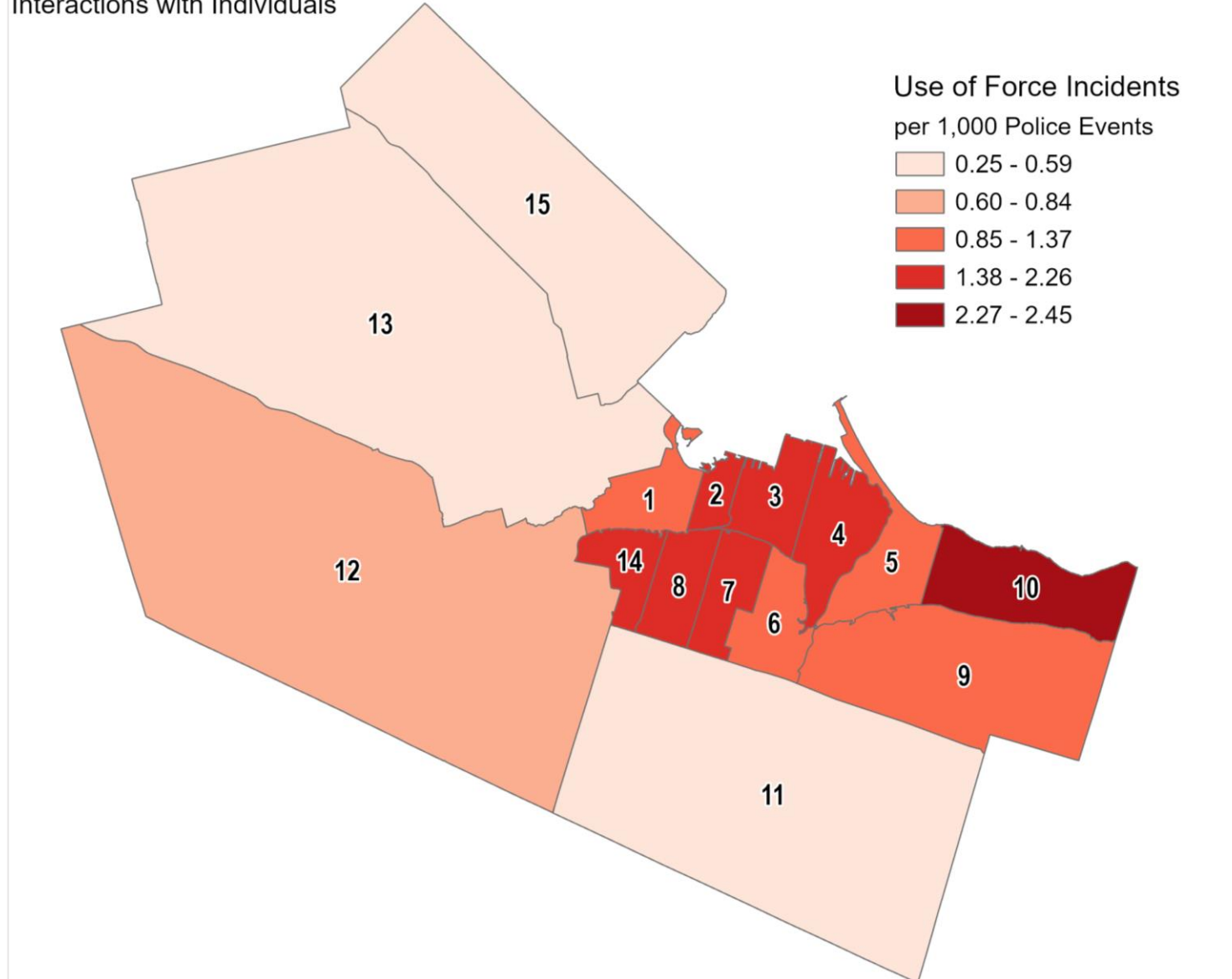


Table 1 summarizes the composition of person-involved use-of-force incidents by incident type from 2023 to 2025 (counts are provided in **Appendix Table A1**). In 2025, consistent with prior years, use-of-force remained concentrated in a relatively small number of higher-risk operational contexts. The two most prominent categories were weapon-related incidents (70 incidents; 34.5%) and warrant execution (29 incidents; 14.3%). Together, these accounted for 99 of 203 incidents—nearly half of all person-involved use-of-force cases.

This concentration highlights that force is most often applied in structured enforcement situations or where there is a credible risk of serious harm. Weapon-related incidents involve actual or perceived access to weapons, while warrant executions are planned enforcement actions where risk factors are often known in advance. The continued prominence of these categories reinforces that use-of-force is more closely associated with higher-risk environments than with routine service calls.

Beyond this overall concentration, the composition of incidents has shifted over time. Most notably, weapon-related incidents have increased steadily as a share of all use-of-force cases, rising from 26.8% in 2023 to 31.7% in 2024 and 34.5% in 2025. This indicates that, even as overall use-of-force volumes have declined, a larger proportion of incidents involve perceived weapons.

Incidents involving intimate partner violence (IPV) increased notably in 2025, rising from 3.8% in 2024 to 7.9%. Family and neighbour disputes also increased, from 3.5% to 6.9%. Together, these shifts indicate that a larger share of use-of-force incidents is occurring in domestic and conflict-driven situations, where officers must manage heightened risk, emotional intensity, and rapidly changing circumstances.

In contrast, several categories declined in proportional terms. Person in crisis calls decreased from 12.2% in 2023 to 10.8% in 2024 and 7.4% in 2025. Disturbance-related incidents, stolen vehicle calls, barricaded subjects, and person stops also declined as a share of total incidents. Warrant executions, while still a major category, decreased in 2025 following a peak in 2024.

Importantly, these changes reflect shifts in composition rather than volume alone. While incident counts declined across most categories between 2024 and 2025, the increasing share of weapon-related incidents and IPV-related calls suggests that the remaining cases are more concentrated in higher-risk situations.

Perceived Weapon Incidents

In addition to the type of incident, the Use-of-Force form also captures whether officers believed a subject had access to a weapon at the time of the interaction. This reflects the officer's perception based on the information available to them in the moment, including observed behaviour, statements, or situational context. This measure provides an additional layer of context by helping to distinguish between incidents involving subjects perceived to be armed and those that are not. In doing so, it offers further insight into the level of risk officers may have been responding to when force was used.

As shown in **Figure 13**, a majority of both subjects and incidents involved a perceived weapon across all three years. In 2023, 62.2% of subjects and 65% of incidents involved a subject perceived to have access to a weapon. This increased to 68.6% of subjects and 69.9% of incidents in 2024, and further to 72.1% of subjects and about 75% of incidents in 2025.

The consistent gap between subject-level and incident-level percentages reflects that incidents involving perceived weapons often include multiple subjects. More importantly, the upward trend across both measures indicates that an increasing share of use-of-force incidents is occurring in situations where officers perceive the presence of a weapon. Taken together, this data suggests that, even as overall use-of-force volumes have declined, the remaining incidents are increasingly concentrated in higher-risk situations where the perceived potential for harm is elevated.

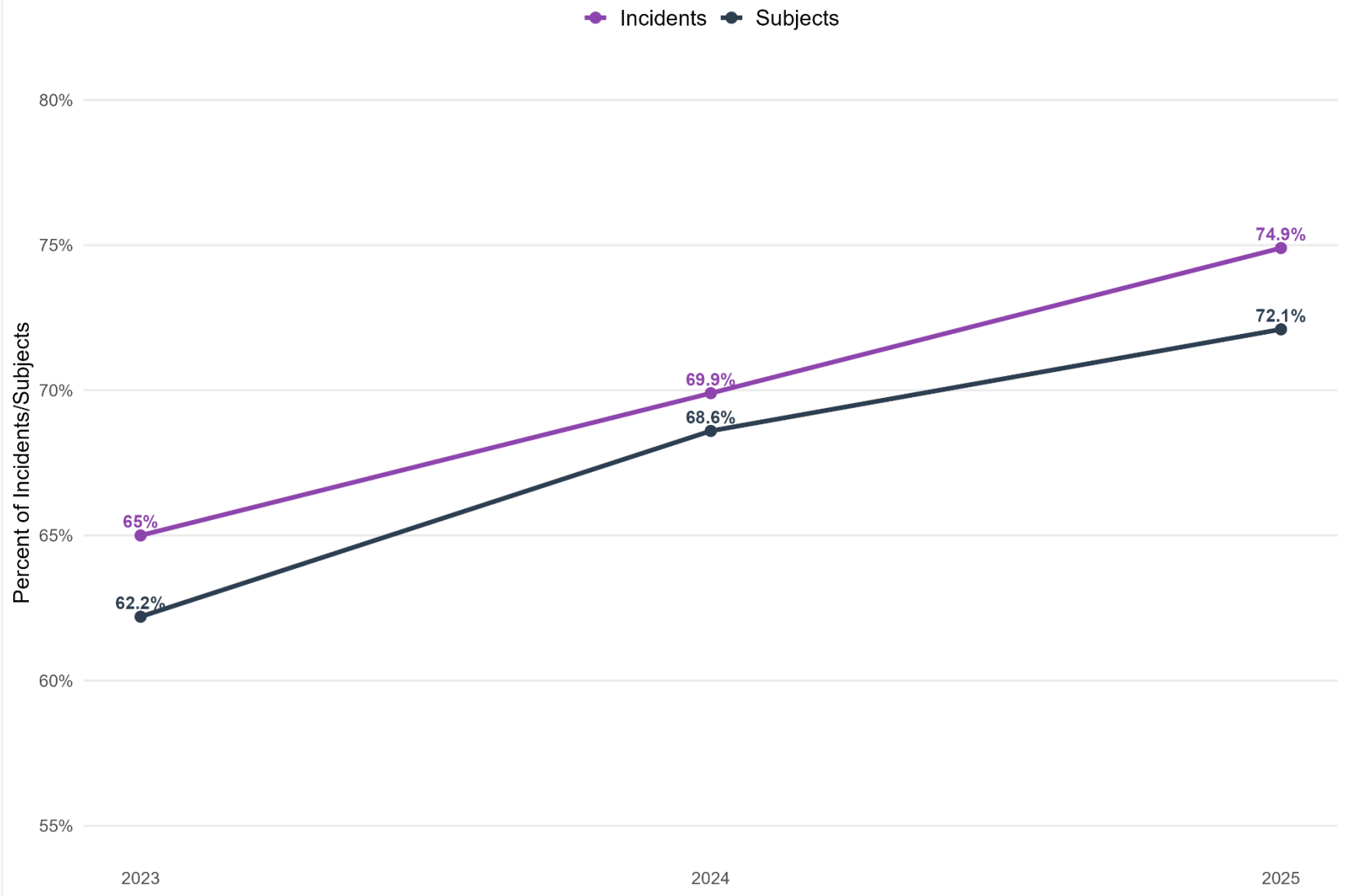
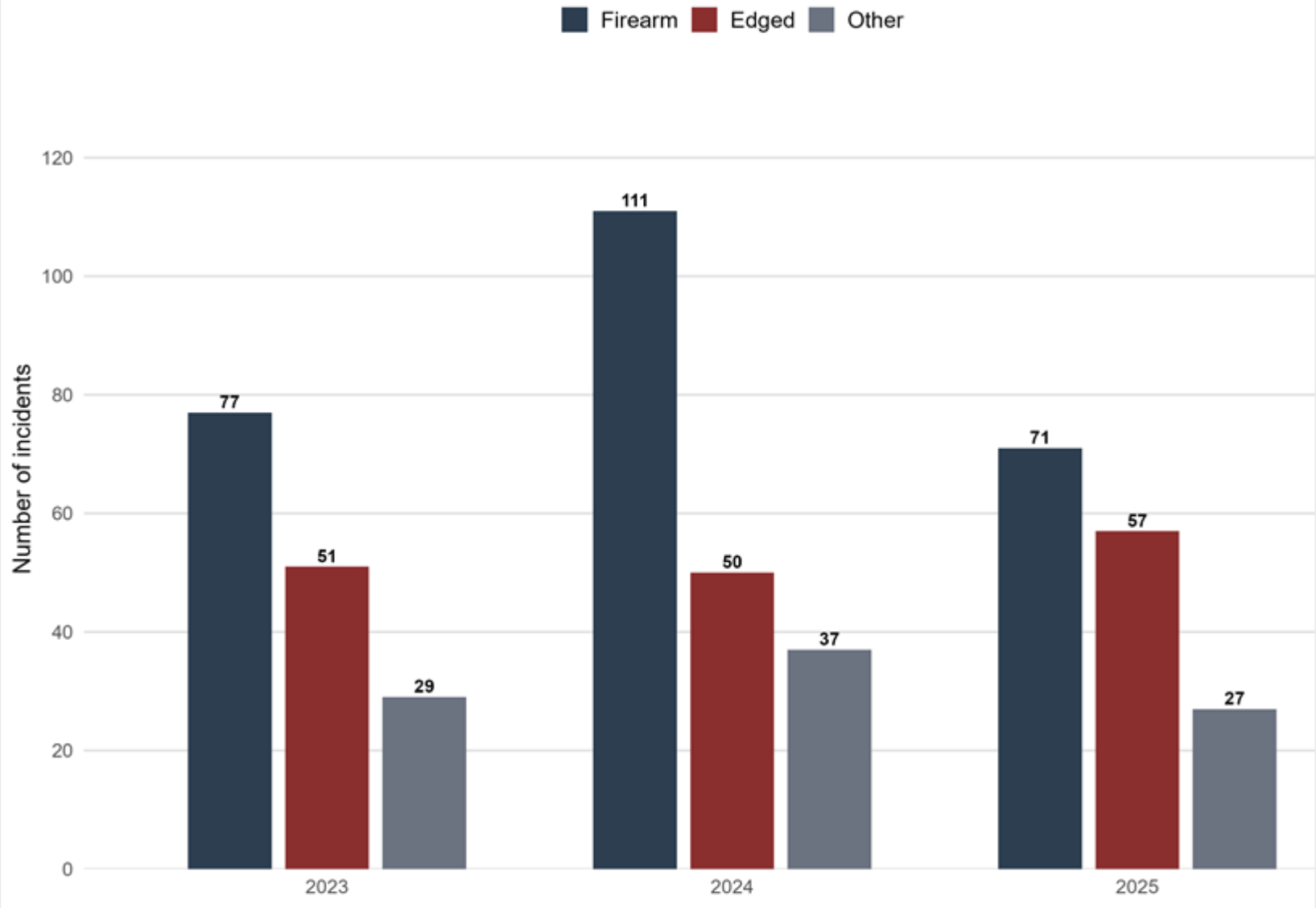


Figure 14: Type of Perceived Weapon (2023–2025)

Figure 14 shows the types of weapons officers perceived subjects to have access to during use-of-force incidents in 2025. Firearms were the most commonly perceived weapon type, identified in 71 incidents. Edged weapons were the next most common, identified in 57 incidents, while other weapon types were identified in 27 incidents. These included weapons recorded as "other" (14 incidents), unknown weapon types (9 incidents), vehicles (3 incidents), aerosol weapons (3 incidents), and club or impact weapons (1 incident).

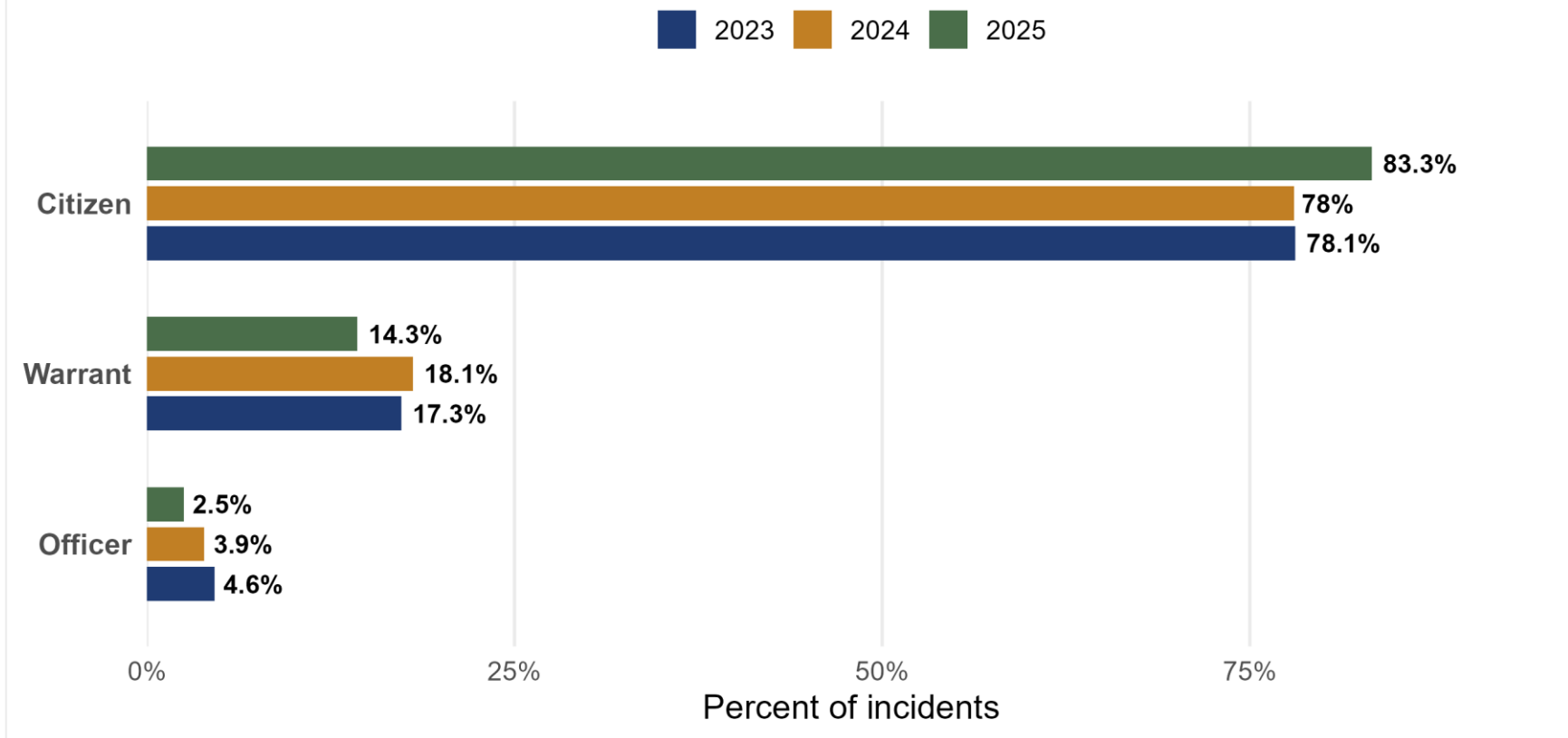

Figure 13: Subjects and Incidents Involving Perceived Weapon (2023–2025)

Recovered Weapons and Objects

The perceived presence of a weapon provides important context for understanding how officers assessed risk during use-of-force incidents. However, perceived weapon information and recovered weapon information answer different questions. Perceived weapon information reflects the risk understood by officers at the time of the interaction, based on caller or witness reports, observed behaviour, subject actions, environmental conditions, and any investigative information known before or during the incident. Recovered weapon information reflects what was later confirmed through arrest, search, scene containment, property recovery, or subsequent investigation. This distinction is important. The fact that a firearm or edged weapon was not ultimately recovered does not, on its own, mean that the firearm- or weapon-related response was unnecessary or disproportionate. In many incidents, officers were responding to reported threats, rapidly evolving behaviour, and intelligence about possible weapon access. At the same time, recovery outcomes remain important for transparency and public understanding. They help distinguish between incidents involving confirmed weapons, imitation or replica firearms, gun-shaped objects, intelligence-led operations, and call- or witness-based reports where no weapon was ultimately found.

In response to broader public and Board interest in greater transparency around weapons-related use-of-force incidents, the Service undertook additional analysis to examine whether perceived weapons were ultimately confirmed or recovered, and the type of weapon or object involved. This information is not captured in a structured format within the provincially mandated Ontario Use-of-Force reporting framework. As a result, the analysis required detailed review of occurrence records, property submissions, and associated investigative files.

In 2025, 71 incidents involved the perceived presence of a firearm. Of these incidents, 12 involved the recovery of a real firearm. These included handguns recovered during arrests, firearms located during tactical warrant executions, and incidents linked to shootings, robbery investigations, or firearm-related violence. In several incidents, firearms were recovered directly from subjects or located within residences, vehicles, or areas immediately accessible to the subject during the interaction.

A further 16 incidents involved imitation, BB, pellet, airsoft, paintball, or replica firearms that closely resembled real firearms. These included items such as Glock 17 and Glock 19 Gen3 BB handguns, Crosman air pistols and rifles, a Daisy Powerline air pistol, a Marksman BB rifle, Umarex and Tanfoglio-style BB pistols, and paintball-style firearms. Some involved reported robberies, including incidents where handguns were reportedly used to threaten victims. Others involved weapons calls where witnesses reported a person carrying, pointing, loading, or brandishing what appeared to be a handgun or long gun in public. In other cases, officers encountered imitation firearms during vehicle stops, wanted-person arrests, or calls involving subjects fleeing, refusing commands, or behaving in ways that prevented officers from safely confirming whether the firearm was real. In these cases, officers could not safely determine in real time whether the object was a real firearm, particularly where the object was visible only briefly, concealed in a waistband or vehicle, discarded during flight, or modelled after a real firearm.

An additional 9 incidents involved gun-shaped objects that were not firearms but reasonably appeared to be firearms at the time of the interaction. These primarily included pistol-shaped cigarette lighters, torch-style lighters, and other firearm-shaped objects. Several were black or metallic and were held, displayed, or carried in ways that were consistent with how a handgun might appear during a rapidly evolving encounter. One incident involved a pistol-style lighter with a functional slide, while others involved black handgun-shaped lighters, a silver revolver-style lighter, a gun decal, and a Nerf gun.

Another 16 incidents involved ERU, tactical, warrant, or intelligence-led operations where no firearm was ultimately recovered. These included *Criminal Code* and CDSA search warrants, tactical assists, and high-risk arrests where officers had grounds to believe a firearm may be present based on investigative information, prior violence, firearm-related offences, or links to recent shootings. These operations typically involved planned high-risk entry, containment, or arrest procedures where officers are trained to respond to the possibility of firearm access until the scene can be safely secured. A further 4 incidents involved subjects with known firearm history, outstanding firearm charges, or recent confirmed firearm links, but no firearm was recovered during the interaction. These included subjects wanted on firearm-related offences, subjects recently linked to recovered firearms, and individuals believed through investigative information to have access to firearms. In these cases, the perceived firearm risk was based on specific information about the individual rather than a general or unsupported concern.

The remaining 12 incidents were call- or witness-based firearm reports where no firearm was recovered. These included reports of a person threatening to shoot someone, a person boarding a bus with a handgun visible in the waistband, a large

fight involving reports of firearms and other weapons, a stabbing suspect reportedly fleeing with a firearm, a hospital security call where multiple witnesses stated a subject had a gun, a public parking lot call involving a reported handgun in a vehicle, and a reported robbery in progress involving multiple armed suspects.

Taken together, the findings show that perceived firearm incidents are not a single type of event. They include confirmed firearms, imitation or replica firearms, gun-shaped objects, tactical and intelligence-led operations, and call-based reports where no firearm was ultimately found. Across these categories, officers were often responding to circumstances involving reported threats, observed behaviour, investigative intelligence, or objects that were operationally indistinguishable from real firearms at the time. The recovery outcome is therefore important context, but it should not be treated as the only measure of whether the perceived firearm risk was reasonable in the moment.

The review also examined incidents involving perceived edged weapons. In 2025, 59 incidents involved the perceived presence of an edged weapon. Of these, 39 involved a confirmed edged weapon. These included knives, kitchen knives, hunting knives, box cutters, exacto-style blades, machete-style weapons, and other sharp objects. In many confirmed incidents, the weapon was visible to officers on arrival, held by the subject during the interaction, recovered from the subject, or located within the immediate scene following the arrest. A further 14 incidents were classified as reported or information-driven edged-weapon incidents where no edged weapon was ultimately confirmed. These incidents were typically initiated by 911 calls, witness information, victim reports, or subject statements indicating that a knife, machete, axe, or other edged weapon was present, had been used, or was accessible. Examples included reported stabbings, robbery calls involving knives, domestic incidents involving threats with knives, large fights where weapons were reported, and calls where subjects were believed to have access to knives inside a residence.

Although no edged weapon was recovered in these 14 incidents, that outcome should be interpreted alongside the information available to officers at the time. In several cases, officers were responding to reports that a stabbing had occurred, that a suspect may still be armed, that a weapon had been used to threaten another person, or that a subject had access to a weapon inside a residence. In these circumstances, the absence of a recovered weapon does not, by itself, mean that the perceived risk was unfounded or that the response was unnecessary. Rather, it reflects the distinction between the risk officers were required to assess during the incident and what was later confirmed after the scene was secured.

Another 5 incidents were classified as behaviour-driven or inferred-risk incidents, where no specific edged weapon was confirmed but the subject's behaviour or situational context created concern about possible weapon access. These incidents involved circumstances such as subjects hiding, refusing to show their hands, fleeing from police, physically resisting arrest, or reaching toward pockets or areas where a weapon could have been concealed. Several occurred in volatile domestic or wanted-person contexts, where officers were responding to active violence, threats, or rapidly evolving risk. In these behaviour-driven incidents, the perceived weapon risk was not based on a confirmed sighting of a knife or edged weapon. Rather, it arose from the combination of subject behaviour, non-compliance, concealment, prior information, and the broader circumstances of the call. No edged weapon was ultimately located in these cases, but officers were required to make real-time decisions before that outcome was known.

Overall, the recovered weapons review adds important context to the perceived weapon data reported through the provincial Use-of-Force framework. The analysis shows that many incidents involved confirmed firearms or edged weapons, while others involved imitation firearms, gun-shaped objects, caller or witness information, investigative intelligence, or subject behaviour that created concern about possible weapon access. These distinctions matter because perceived weapon incidents can vary significantly in their underlying circumstances, even when they are captured in the data under the same broad category.

The findings also reinforce the importance of interpreting weapon-related use-of-force through both real-time risk assessment and after-the-fact recovery outcomes. Recovery information helps improve transparency and provides a clearer picture of what was ultimately found. However, it does not fully capture the uncertainty officers may face when responding to reported weapons, active threats, concealed objects, rapidly changing behaviour, or high-risk enforcement operations. For this reason, the recovered weapons analysis should be understood as additional context that strengthens public reporting, rather than as a simple confirmation or rejection of the risk perceived during the incident.

5. Member Information

Use-of-Force can occur across a range of operational settings. The following section summarizes officer attire, assignment type, report structure (team vs. individual), and years of service at the time force was applied. **Figure 17** presents the distribution of officer attire in person-involved use-of-force incidents from 2023 to 2025. Across all three years, incidents overwhelmingly involved uniformed members. In 2023, 98.3% of incidents involved uniformed officers (233 of 237 incidents). In 2024, the proportion was 96.8% (273 of 282 incidents), and in 2025 it was 98% (199 of 203 incidents). Plain-clothes involvement remained uncommon across the period, representing less than 3% of incidents in any given year.

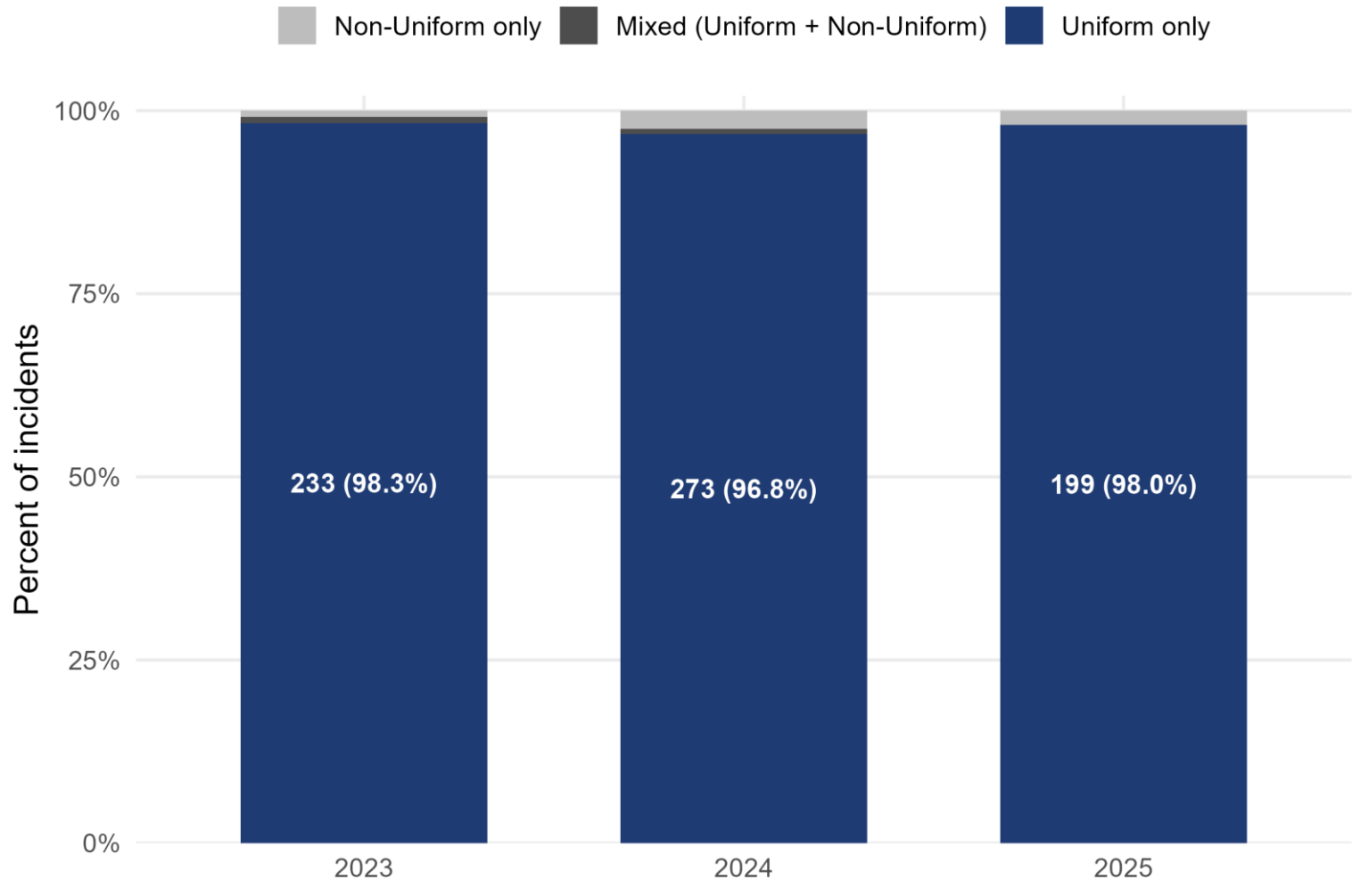


Figure 18: Assignment Type (2023–2025)

Figure 18 presents the distribution of assignment type for person-involved use-of-force incidents from 2023 to 2025. Across all three years, Patrol members accounted for the majority of incidents. In 2023, 71.7% of incidents involved Patrol; in 2024, 69.9%; and in 2025, 80.3%. While the overall number of use-of-force incidents declined in 2025, the proportional share involving Patrol increased, reflecting the central role of frontline response in these encounters. Tactical involvement declined over the period, representing 20.3% of incidents in 2023, 16.3% in 2024, and 13.3% in 2025. All other assignments combined represented a comparatively small share of incidents each year, ranging from approximately 6.6% to 13.8%. These included specialized units such as Guns and Gangs.

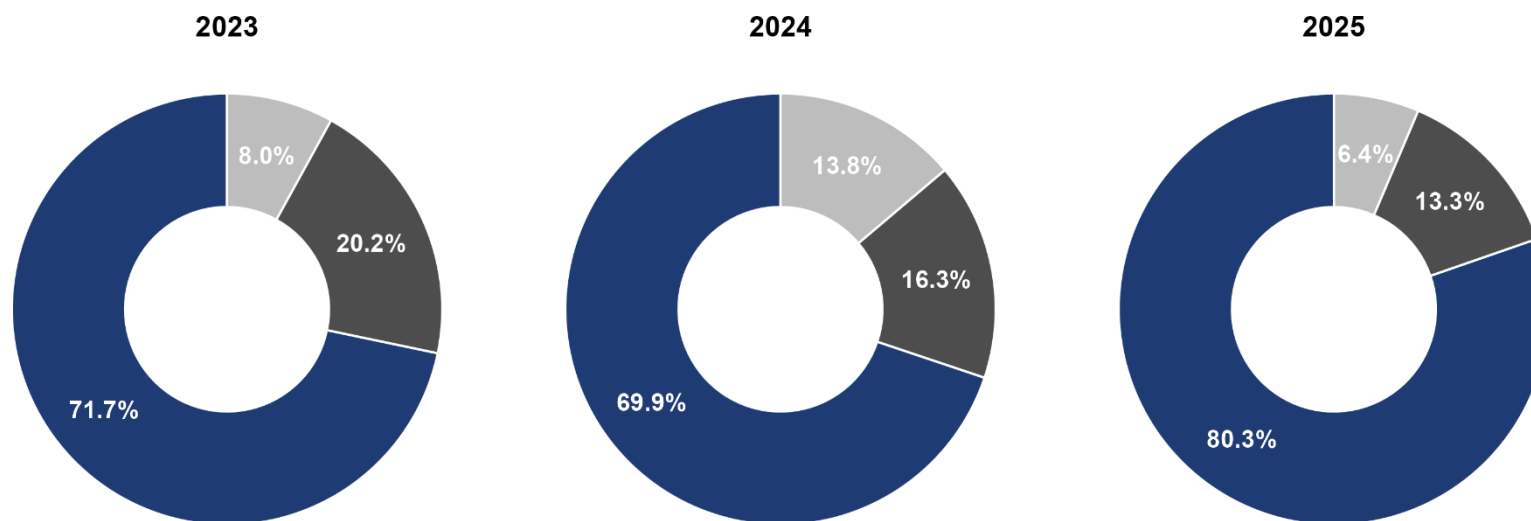


Figure 19: Report Structure (Team vs. Individual), 2023–2025

Figure 19 presents the structure of report submissions associated with person-involved incidents from 2023 to 2025. In 2025, 116 incidents (56%) involved a team report submission, while 91 incidents (44%) involved an individual report. This distribution is consistent with 2024, when team reports accounted for 56% of incidents and individual reports for 44%. In contrast, 2023 reflected a different pattern, with individual reports comprising 69.7% of incidents and team reports accounting for 30.3%.

It is important to distinguish between incidents and reports. An incident refers to a single occurrence in which force was applied. A report refers to a submission completed by one or more officers involved in that incident. Because multiple officers may be involved in the same incident, the number of reports submitted will not necessarily match the number of incidents recorded. Prior to 2023, only the Emergency Response Unit was permitted to submit a single report per incident. Other units, including frontline patrol, were required to submit individual reports for each officer involved. As a result, a single incident could generate multiple reports.

In 2023, the Ministry revised its reporting guidelines. Officers who applied the same level of force during the same incident—without causing injury requiring medical intervention—were permitted to submit a single collective (team) report. This typically includes circumstances such as drawing or pointing a firearm or conducted energy weapon (CEW). However, any officer whose use-of-force resulted in an injury requiring medical attention—such as a CEW discharge, mental health apprehension, or physical injury—remains required to file a separate individual report. Under this framework, a single incident may generate one team report, multiple individual reports, or both a team and individual report, depending on the circumstances.

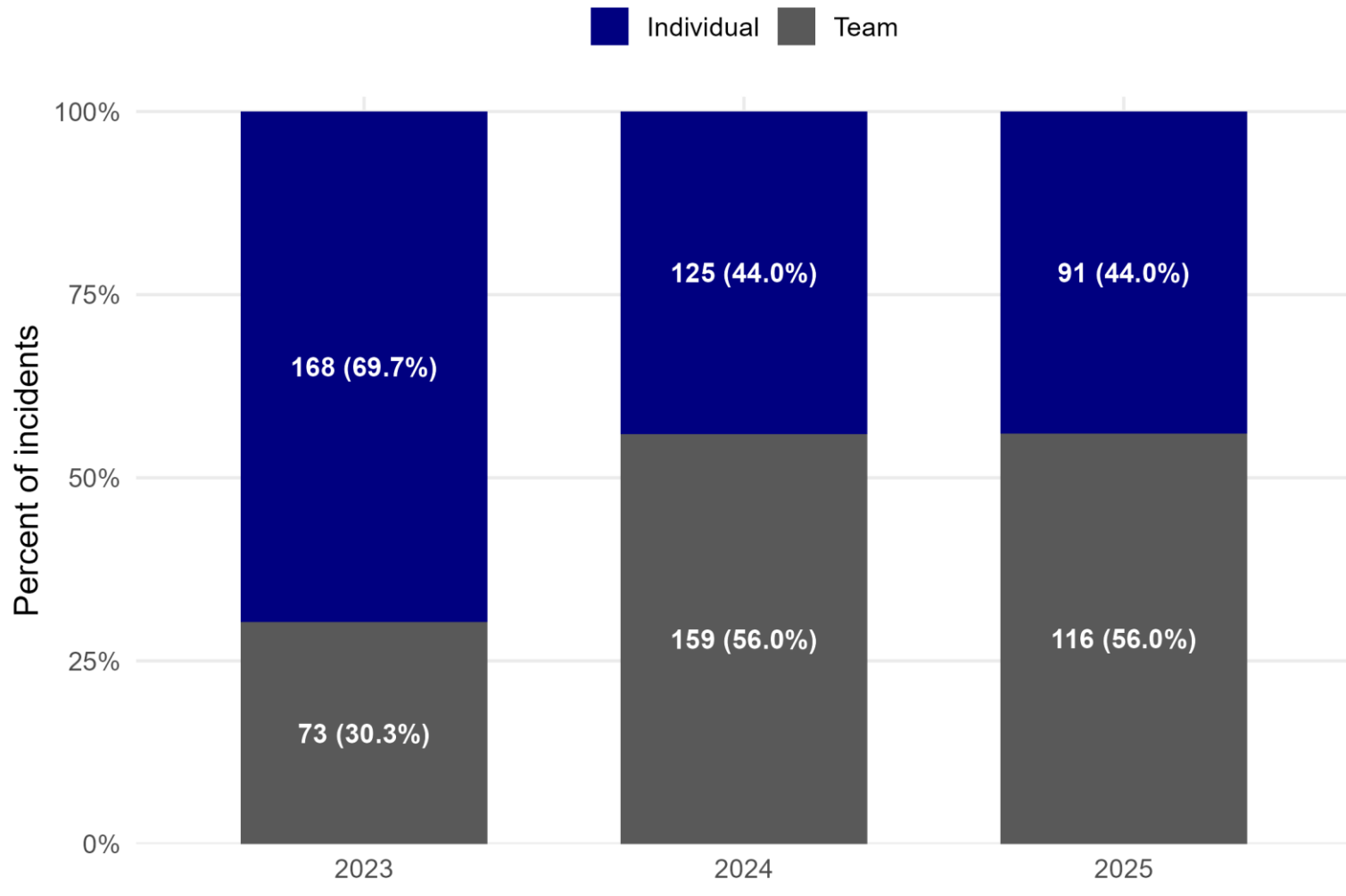
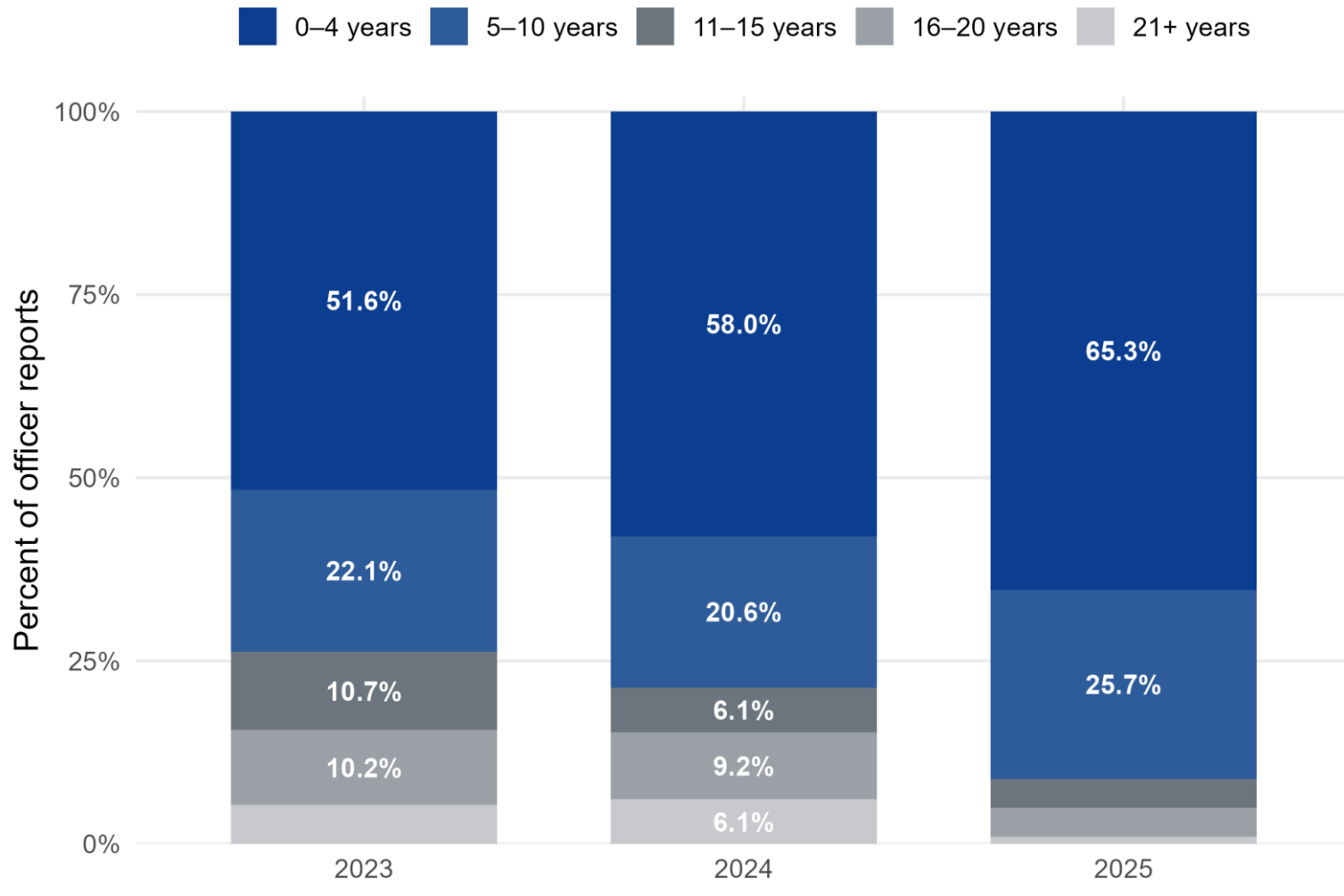


Figure 20: Years of Service (Individual Reports Only), 2023–2025

Figure 20 presents the distribution of years of service among officers who submitted individual use-of-force reports between 2023 and 2025. Years of service are captured only on individual report forms. Collective or team reports do not include officer tenure information, as multiple members may be included within a single submission. As a result, this is a limited subset of the overall use-of-force data and should not be treated as representative of all officers involved in use-of-force incidents. In 2025, officers with 0–4 years of service accounted for 66 individual reports, representing 65.4% of all individual submissions. Officers with 5–10 years of service accounted for 26 reports (25.7%). Together, officers with ten or fewer years of service represented more than 91% of individual reports submitted in 2025.

This pattern should be interpreted with caution. Individual reports accounted for 91 incidents, or 44% of person-involved use-of-force incidents in 2025. The remaining incidents involved team reporting, where officer tenure is not captured. For these reasons, the years-of-service data provide only a partial view of the experience profile of reporting officers. This distribution is also influenced by operational deployment patterns. Frontline patrol—where reportable use-of-force incidents most commonly occur—includes a substantial proportion of early-career officers, including newly sworn members. Accordingly, these figures should not be interpreted as evidence that officer tenure alone explains use-of-force involvement. Rather, they describe the limited subset of officers for whom years-of-service information is available.

6. Injuries

Figure 21 presents subject injuries recorded in use-of-force reports from 2023 to 2025, including the type of treatment received where applicable. In 2023, 33 of 445 subjects involved in use-of-force interactions sustained a physical injury, representing 7.4% of all subjects. In 2024, 34 of 452 subjects were injured (7.5%), and in 2025, 21 of 323 subjects were injured (6.5%).

Among injured subjects, medical facility treatment was the most commonly recorded treatment type across all three years, reported for 72.7% of injured subjects in 2023, 67.7% in 2024, and 61.9% in 2025. First aid or on-scene medical care was recorded for 45.5% of injured subjects in 2023, 38.2% in 2024, and 52.4% in 2025. It is important to note that these treatment categories are not mutually exclusive, as an injured subject may have received multiple levels of care, such as first aid at the scene followed by transport to a medical facility, and percentages may therefore sum to more than 100%. No treatment was recorded for a very small number of injured subjects in 2023 (3%) and 2024 (5.9%), and for none in 2025.

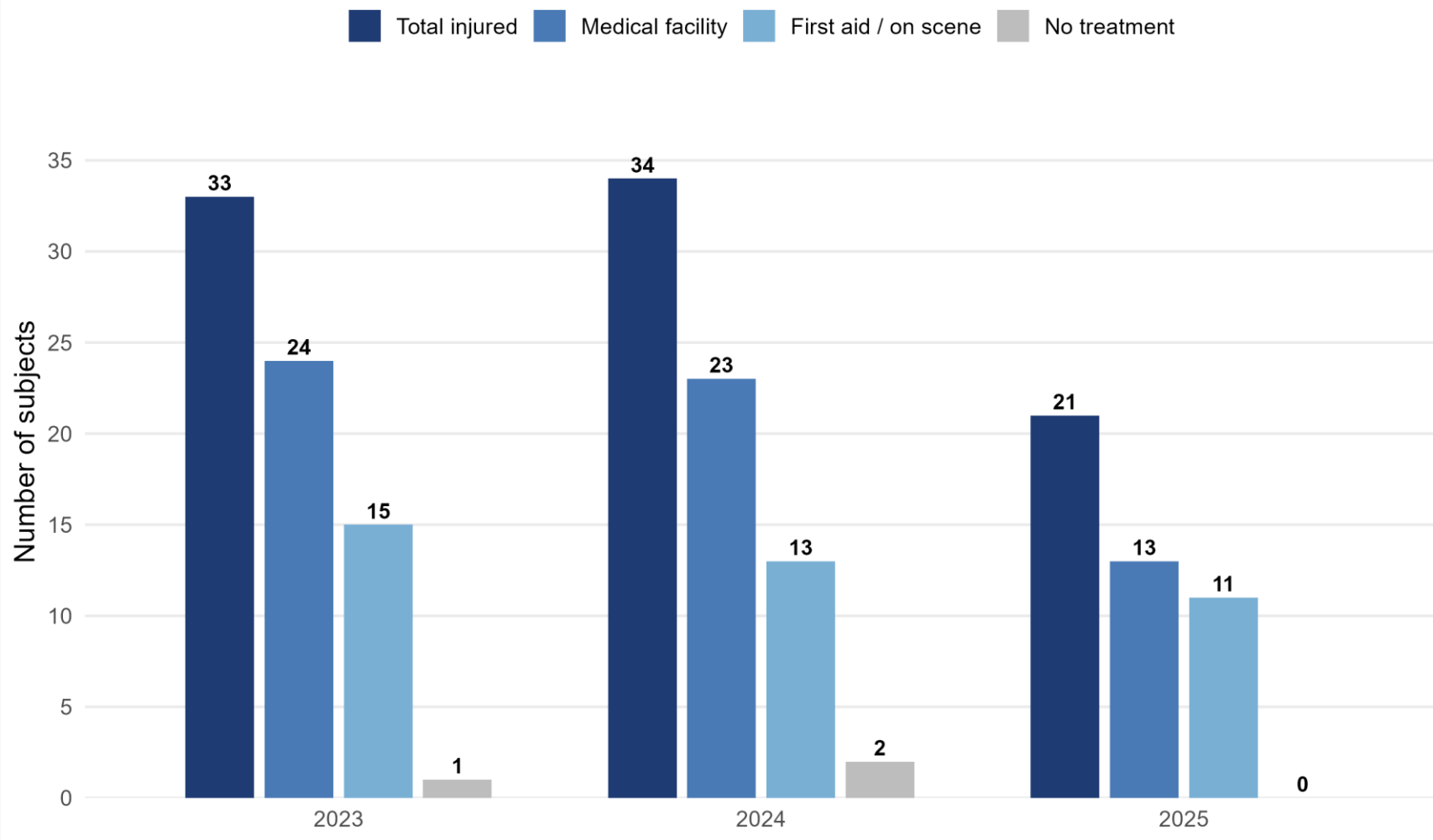


Figure 22: Officer Injuries by Treatment Type (2023–2025)

Figure 22 presents officer injuries recorded across all use-of-force reports from 2023 to 2025. Across the three-year period, officer injury rates remained low. In 2023, 12 of 358 reports recorded an officer injury (3.4%). In 2024, this declined to 8 of 316 reports (2.5%), before rising modestly to 9 of 250 reports (3.6%) in 2025.

7. Race, Identity, and Demographic Profile of Use-of-Force Subjects

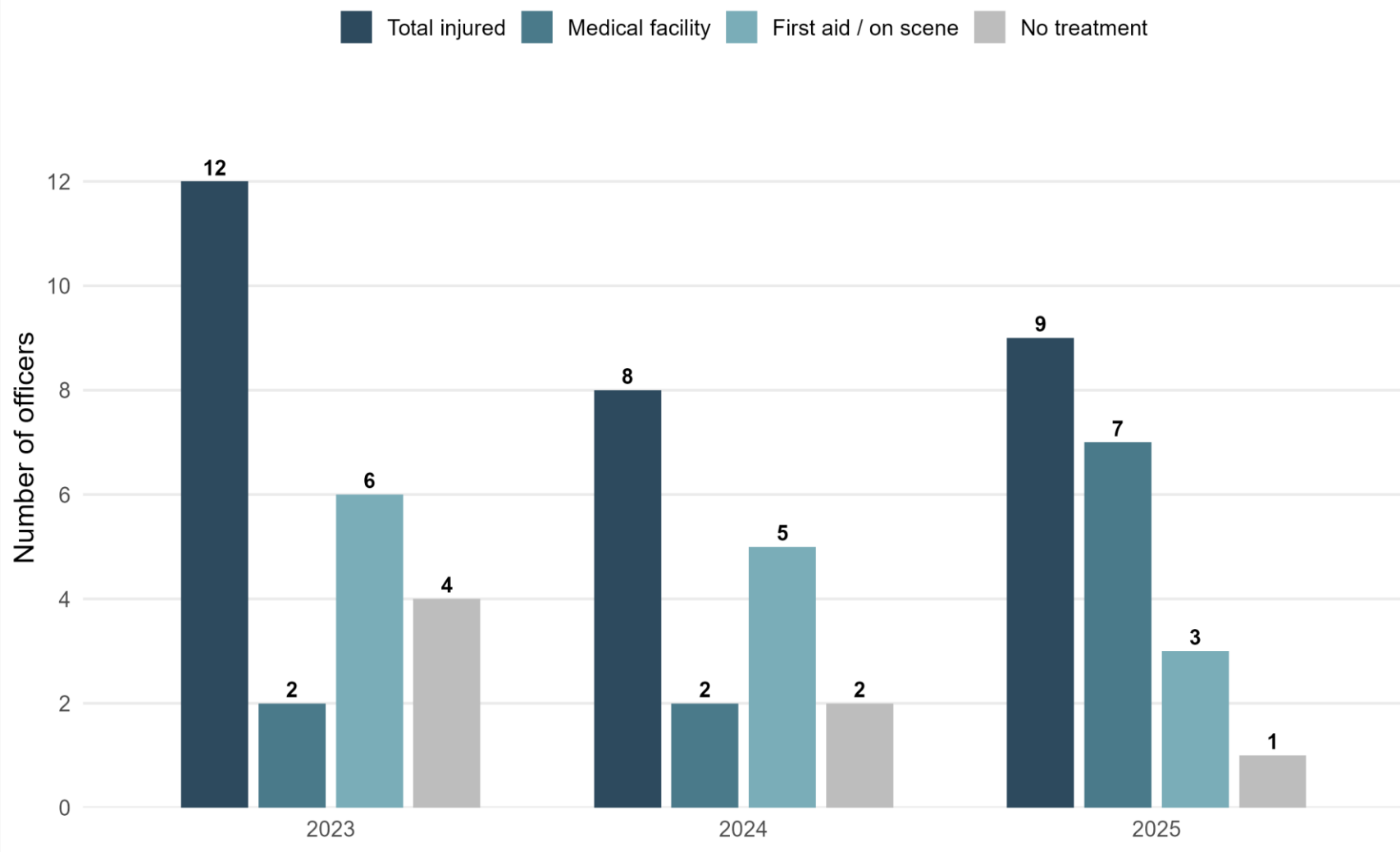


Figure 23: Use-of-Force Subjects by Gender (2023–2025)

This section presents demographic characteristics of individuals involved in use-of-force interactions, including perceived gender, race, and age. These data provide descriptive context and should be interpreted alongside the broader operational and situational factors discussed throughout this report. In 2025, 256 of 323 individuals involved in use-of-force interactions were perceived to be male, 65 as female, and 2 as transgender/non-binary/other (**Figure 23**). This distribution has remained consistent across the three years for which subject-level gender data is available. In 2023, 360 of 445 subjects were perceived to be male and 84 as female. In 2024, 363 of 452 subjects were perceived male and 89 as female.

[Under O. Reg. 267/18](#), police services are also required to collect and report de-identified race-based data through use-of-force report submissions. Since 2020, officers have been required to record a subject's perceived race (up to three subjects per incident). In 2023, the reporting structure was updated to accommodate more than three subjects per incident. The selection of a subject's race is based on the officer's perception at the time of the incident—officers do not ask individuals about their race or seek verification.

Of the 323 individuals involved in a use-of-force incident, 199 were perceived by officers as White, 58 as Black, 40 as Middle Eastern, 10 as Indigenous, 8 as Latino, 4 as East or Southeast Asian, and 4 as South Asian. As shown in **Figure 24**, the overall decline in use-of-force volume observed across the six-year period is reflected in most race groups in absolute terms. Individuals perceived as White declined from 324 in 2020 to 199 in 2025, a decrease of 38.6%. Perceived Black individuals declined from 112 to 58, a decrease of nearly 50%. East and Southeast Asian individuals declined from 25 to 4, South Asian individuals from 10 to 4, and Indigenous individuals from 12 to 10. These declines are broadly consistent with the overall reduction in use-of-force incidents rather than reflecting changes specific to any group.

Those perceived as Middle Eastern did not follow the same downward trend. The count increased from 26 in 2020 to 40 in 2025, a change of 53.8%, against a backdrop of overall declining use-of-force volume. Latino subjects remained unchanged at 8 over the same period. It is important to note that these figures reflect absolute counts of subjects rather than incidents, and that some of the Middle Eastern subject count in any given year reflects multi-subject incidents where several individuals were involved in the same occurrence.

All use-of-force reports. Treatment categories are not mutually exclusive.

Figure 25: Use-of-Force Subjects by Age Category (2025)

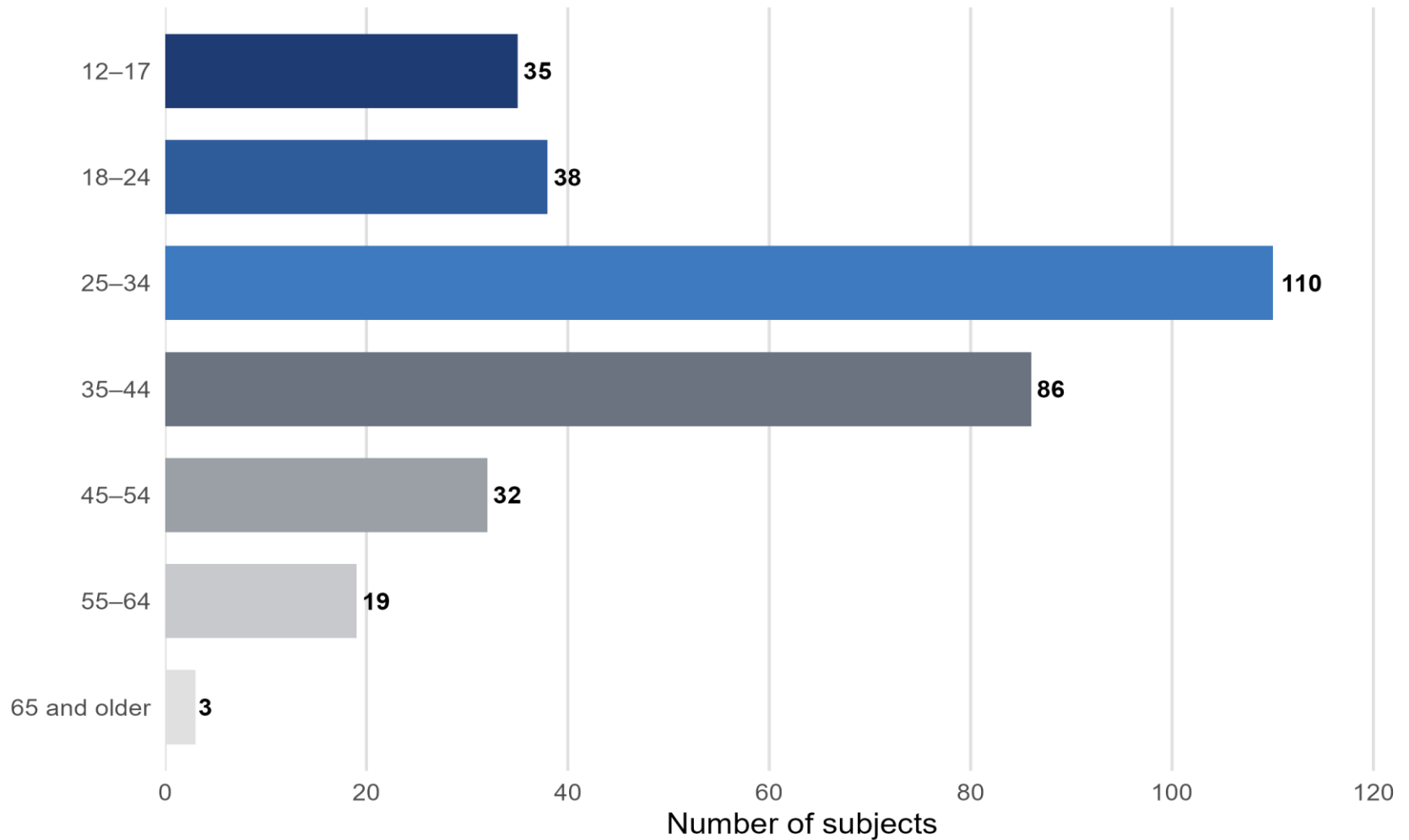
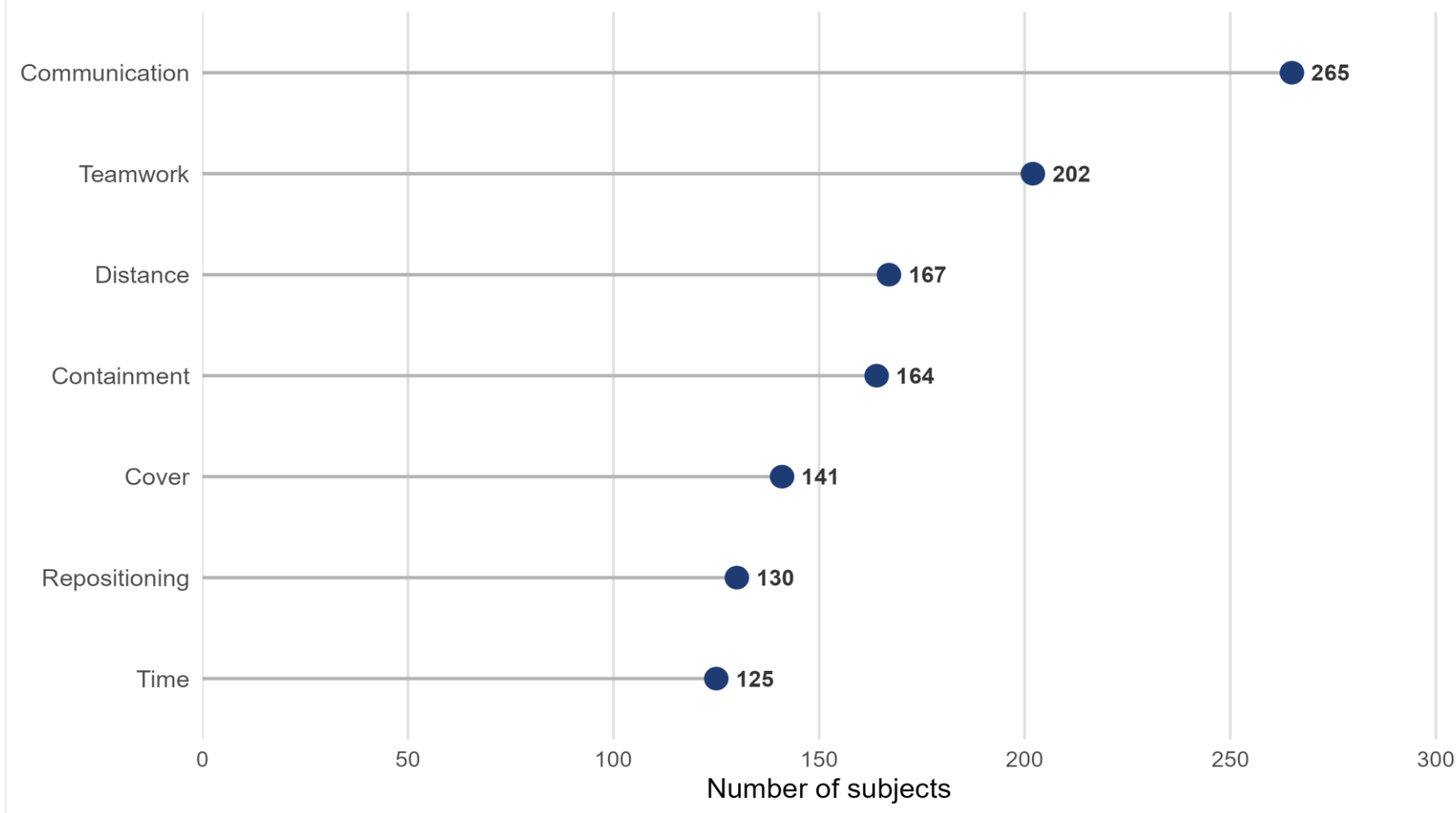


Figure 26: De-escalation Techniques Used (2025)

These counts describe who was involved in reported use-of-force incidents, but they do not, on their own, measure racial disproportionality or disparity. Disproportionality can be assessed by comparing a group's share of use-of-force involvement with its share of a relevant benchmark. Historically, census population-based comparisons have shown that some racialized groups, particularly individuals perceived as Black or Indigenous, are overrepresented in use-of-force data relative to their share of Hamilton's population as measured by the 2021 Census.

Population-based benchmarking is important because it identifies which communities bear a disproportionate share of use-of-force involvement relative to the broader population. However, it does not distinguish between two related stages: who comes into contact with police and what occurs once that contact has taken place. A group may be overrepresented relative to the general population because of differences in exposure to police contact, the circumstances in which contact occurs, decisions made during an encounter, or broader social and systemic conditions.

The Community Advisory Panel therefore recommended that HPS move toward an interaction-based benchmark that compares a group's share of use-of-force involvement with its share of police interactions, while continuing to report population-based comparisons to monitor broader systemic disparities. This approach is intended to help distinguish between disparities that may arise through differential exposure to police contact and those that may occur once an interaction is underway. The Hamilton Police Service's Race and Identity-Based Data Strategy examines these issues in greater depth through multiple benchmarks, contextual and multivariate analysis, and community-guided interpretation. 8. Details of De-Escalation

In 2025, officers attempted de-escalation in 267 of 323 subject interactions—82.7% of all use-of-force encounters involving individuals. De-escalation was not attempted in the remaining 56 interactions (17.3%). Where de-escalation was attempted, communication was the most frequently used technique, applied in 265 interactions. This was followed by teamwork (202), distance (167), containment (164), cover (141), repositioning (130), and time (125), as shown in **Figure 26**. Multiple techniques were often used in combination within a single interaction, reflecting the structured and layered nature of de-escalation in practice. The high frequency of communication and teamwork is consistent with a coordinated, multi-officer approach to managing elevated-risk situations prior to the application of force.

Where de-escalation was not attempted, officers were required to document the reason. In 47 interactions, officers indicated that immediate action was required. In 29 interactions, an imminent threat was present that did not permit a deliberate de-escalation approach. In 9 interactions, de-escalation had been performed by other officers already on scene, and in 2 interactions another reason was recorded. These reasons account for all 56 interactions where de-escalation was not attempted. The incident type breakdown for the 56 interactions where de-escalation was not attempted shows that weapon-related incidents accounted for the largest share—30 incidents involving 39 subjects. This is consistent with the reasons cited, as weapon-related calls are more likely to involve imminent threat conditions or require an immediate response. The remaining cases were distributed across traffic, violent crime, family and neighbour disputes, person in crisis, police custody, property crime, and warrant execution, each accounting for a small number of cases.

9. Key Findings and Community Reflections

This report provides a local, evidence-based overview of use-of-force incidents involving the Hamilton Police Service in 2025. While use-of-force remains rare relative to overall police–public interactions, each incident carries the potential for significant impact on the individuals involved, their families, communities, and public trust. For that reason, understanding how often force is used, the circumstances in which it occurs, and how those incidents are experienced by the community is an important part of transparency and accountability.

In 2025, reportable use-of-force involving an individual declined to its lowest level in the six-year reporting period. At the same time, the data show that many remaining incidents occurred in higher-risk circumstances, including weapon-related calls, warrant executions, domestic and conflict-related incidents, and situations where officers perceived an elevated risk of harm. These findings provide important context, but they do not lessen the impact that use-of-force incidents can have on the people and communities involved. The Service also recognizes that public understanding of use-of-force is shaped not only by administrative data, but also by lived experience, community trust, and perceptions of safety and fairness. For this reason, the data in this report should be understood as one part of a broader conversation.

Hamilton Police remain committed to transparent reporting, accountability, and ongoing learning. This includes continuing to improve how use-of-force information is collected, analyzed, and shared with the public. The additional analysis of recovered weapons and objects included in this report reflects that commitment by providing more detail about the relationship between perceived risk at the time of police response and what was later recovered or observed. Meaningful and consistent engagement with diverse communities is essential to building trust and strengthening relationships. Over the past three years, Hamilton Police have hosted community town halls to share information about use-of-force reporting, related statistics, legal frameworks, and officer training. These sessions also provide space for community members to ask questions, raise concerns, and share their perspectives and lived experiences.

The Service will continue to support open and honest dialogue with the communities it serves. In addition, more detailed analysis of race and identity-based data is being advanced through the Hamilton Police [Service's Race and Identity-Based Data Strategy](#), in collaboration with the Community Advisory Panel. That work provides a dedicated space to examine questions of disparity, context, and community impact in greater depth than can be addressed through this annual use-of-force report alone.

Use of Force, 2025 Line by Line Review

The data is extracted from Ministry of Solicitor General (SOLGEN) data portal, available in-year to Police Services. Row level data has been extracted for 2025 and prepared for the public in advance of the Ministry of SOLGEN's 2025 data release. Officers are required to submit a form under the conditions outlined in s.14.5 (see report for details). In 2025, SOLGEN has permitted team reports for all members that use the same level of force (i.e. all members drawing firearms). For readability, the data has been transformed to select columns similar to HPS prior data releases from the SOLGEN data and include all occurrence related info on one line, denoting each subject with a '[S] + number'. For example, if there were 2 subjects who were white carrying a gun and knife, respectively, the line will read: [S1] - White, [S2] - White for the subject race and [S1] - gun, [S2] - knife for the subject weapon used.

Readers are cautioned with using the following caveats while reading and interpreting the data:

- the same incident may have multiple reports, limiting the ability to identify the true number of unique subjects
- the same occurrence may have multiple incidents, spanning locations (i.e. homicide investigation)
- prior year comparison is challenging due to changes to the reporting mechanisms made by SOLGEN
- variables may provide some context to the report; however, true context may not be extractable from data points found within the form. This may limit the reader's ability to understand the complex police-subject relationship in relation to the use of force model (balancing public safety, officer safety, and subject safety).
